SO SAYS DALRYMPLE ABOUT NEW YORK.

Man Who is to Advise Chicago on Public Ownership and His First Impressions of American Enterprise.



JAMES DALRYMPLE. Who Comes to Post Chicago on Public Ownership.

New York, May 29.—James Dalrymple, general manager of the street railway lines of Glasgow...

Mr. Dalrymple reached New York on the Commodore Campania and will leave for Chicago, where he will give Mayor Dunne, who was recently elected on a municipal ownership platform...

The Municipal Ownership League of Greater New York, with Mayor Dunne's permission, called Mr. Dalrymple and the lord provost of Glasgow some weeks ago with a view of having the guest of Chicago stop long enough on his way to receive a letter of New York hospitality.

Mr. Dalrymple seemed both surprised and pleased at amount of public discussion and interest that has been invoked by his visit.

"The City of Glasgow owns the roads, collects an average fare of less than two cents in American money, pays better wages and allows shorter hours of labor than privately owned roads," he said.

"Every citizen of a municipality that owns its own public enterprises is a self-constituted inspector," he continued.

"The Glasgow lines cover an area half as large as Chicago. The fare, paid by the passengers, depends entirely on the distance they ride.

"We abandoned the system of giving transfers several years ago, but our cars are not operated half way through the city and then turned back, requiring the passengers the inconveniences that I have observed here already.

"On the busiest of the lines the cars are operated on half-minute schedule, and we have always maintained that a seat is provided for every passenger.

"Every man who works for us is entitled to a pension of half-pay if disabled after fifteen years of service.

"The employees are selected from all lines of industry, and men who have established trades often come to us because the work is remunerative and they know they will not be discharged unless for cause.

"We pay a casualty insurance company \$75,000 year, and they assume the city's liabilities for accidents.

"There are but few people in Glasgow now who are not advocates of municipal ownership. There are some, it is true, but they can be confined exclusively to those who have mercenary reasons for making opposition.

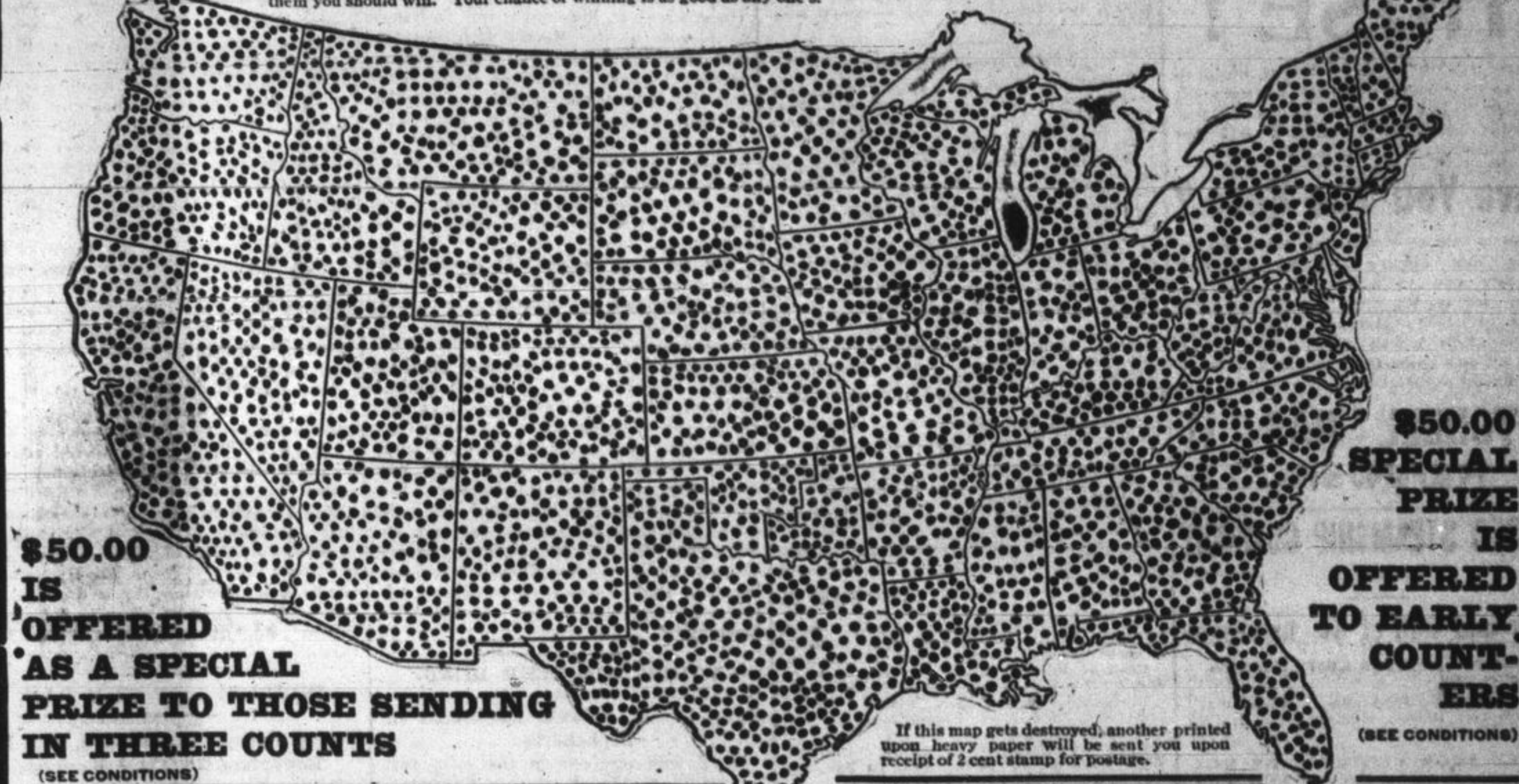
