THE 5 P. M. EDITION. IS DEMORALIZED BY THE NEWS OF THE NAVAL DISASTER.

Troops in Revolt, Reports Livitch—Emperor is Said to Be Still for War—Japanese Learn of Victory.

St. Petersburg, June 2.—Prince Orlonsky, who had an audience with his majesty, found him resolutely determined on the prosecution of the war. Various rumors as to the results of the council are current, all agreeing, however, that a continuance of the war was the first question taken up. The peace party offered a strong line of argument, which was supplemented, it is said, by a despatch from Lieut.-Gen. Linevitch, in which that commander expressed a fear as to the demoralizing effect of the naval disaster on the army, the news of which had already reached the troops from Vladivostok and was rapidly spreading.

Men Learn Of Comrades' Victory. Headquarters of Gen. Kuroki's Army in the Field, May 30th, via Fusan.—A detailed report showing the extent of the Japanese naval victory reached the army to-day. The soldiers received the news quietly. Gen. Kuroki's army has attained to a higher degree of efficiency than at any time since the war began.

Losses in Recent Battle. Tokio, June 2.—The necessity for secrecy no longer existing, the navy department confirms the loss of the Japanese battleship Yamashiro of Port Arthur, in May, 1904, and announces other naval losses heretofore withheld. The list is as follows: Battleship Yamashiro, sunk by a mine, May 15th, 1904, while engaged in blockading Port Arthur.

All Were Guessing. New York, June 2.—The Sun's Washington correspondent says Takahira, the Japanese minister, said yesterday, that all peace talk is mere guessing, and that Japan has not fixed upon any terms.

War Tidings. There is confirmation from good sources that the Russian government suspects the temper of the troops in Manchuria and at home. Many rumors, in reference to the council at Tsarsko-Selo, are to the effect that the council considered the possibility of the Japanese sending an expedition to the Baltic.

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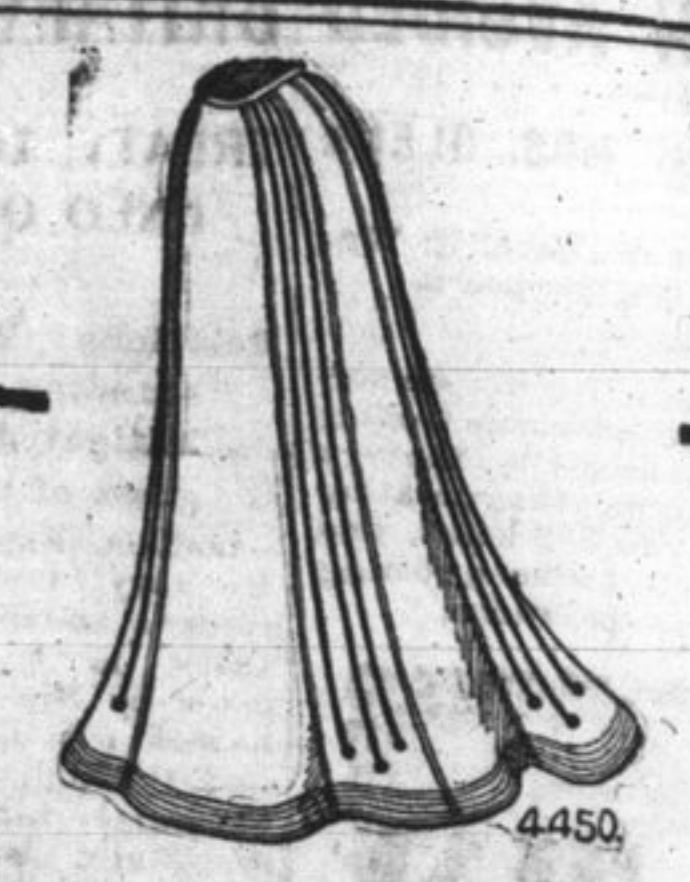
