"DESTINY OF EMPIRE"

DEPENDS ON THIS ACTION' SIGNALLED TOGO.

"You Are All Expected to Do Your Utmost"—Men Were Filled With Inspiration, and Eager for the Fight.

Tokio, June 2.—A Japanese officer who has returned to Saebio gives the following account of the sea fight off the Tu Islands:

"At 5.30 Saturday morning, a wireless message reading, 'The enemy's squadron is in sight,' reached the naval base.

"This message was transmitted to all our ships by the flagship with instructions to get ready for action. Our squadron left their rendezvous and headed for the eastern channel off Tushima.

"Our men seemed to be filled with new inspiration and were eager for the long delayed fight to begin.

"When Tushima was sighted to the south-west, the sea was rough, and the torpedo boats were forced to run for the shelter of the island.

"Our third fighting squadron with the Takashiro, on port reconnoitered the Russian courses and at 11.30 a.m. informed the main squadron by wireless telegraph that the Russian ships were passing into the east channel, whereupon our main squadron, changing its course somewhat to the southward, came in sight of Okinoshima at one o'clock in the afternoon.

"The third division arrived later and joined the main squadron. The first and second divisions, accompanied by the destroyer, then changed to a westerly course, while the third division and the fourth destroyer flotilla headed eastward.

"During the manoeuvre the Russian flagship appeared to the southward at 1.45 o'clock. The Russians steamed up in double column. The fleet was numerous, but no living being was visible.

"The Russian ships seemed to be in good order. Our ships hoisted the flag of action, the Mikasa signaling: 'The destiny of our empire depends upon this action. You are all expected to do your utmost.'

"Our men seemed to silently weigh the significance of this signal.

"Our first and second divisions turned to the Russians' starboard, while the third division kept close in touch with the preceding two divisions. With the Japanese ships proceeding in this order, it was 2.15 o'clock when the Russians opened fire.

"The first two shots fell short of our line, and it was some minutes later before we commenced firing. Then the battle was on with firing from both sides.

"Our destroyers kept on the port side of the main squadron, and in this formation we pressed the Russians against the coast of Kiushiu, and they were obliged to change their course to the east.

"We so manoeuvred our ships as to have their bows paralleled to the north side of the Russian line. The Mikasa, of our first division, which had been leading, changed to the rear of the line, while the Kasuga headed the line. The engagement now became very fierce.

"The Borodino was seen to be on fire. A little later the Russians headed west and we changed our course accordingly. Five ships of our second division concentrated their fire on the Borodino.

"Our first division now began firing vigorously, proceeding parallel with the Russian line, and as we began to press against the head of the Russian line our second division veered to the Russian rear, thus enveloping their ships.

"The engagement proceeded hotly. Our second divisions followed a course parallel with the northern side of the Russians, and this movement completed the envelopment.

"The Russian ships were seen trying to break through, and our destroyer flotilla intercepted their new course. This state of envelopment continued until the following day, with the ships at varying distances.

"Thus inclosed on all sides, the Russians were helpless and powerless to escape the circle.

"Previous instructions had been given to the destroyers and torpedo boats to attack the Russian ships. Following instructions, the fifth destroyer flotilla advanced against a Russian ship, upon which the second division was then concentrating its fire, signaling:

"We are going to give the last thrust at them."

"The Russian ship continued to fight, and, seeing the approaching torpedo boats, directed its fire on them. Undaunted, our destroyers pressed forward, the Chitose meantime continuing its fire.

"The torpedo flotilla arrived with 200 meters of the Russian ship, and the Shiranui fired the first shot. Two other boats fired one each.

"The Shiranui received two shells, but the other boats were not damaged. The Russian ship was completely sunk.

"Shadows saw the battle raging furiously. Our shells were evidently telling on the Russians, who showed signs of confusion.

"Our fifth torpedo flotilla, after destroying the Borodino, followed in the wake of our second division, the signal reading:

"Something like the Russians' submarines have been sighted. Attack them."

"The flotilla followed and located the object which proved to be a sinking ship with its overturned bottom showing. Thirty survivors clung to the wreck. Firing ceased with approach of darkness.

"According to orders previously given for a torpedo attack after dark all the destroyer flotilla, dividing into two squadrons, proceeded to attack the Russians during the whole night.

"The Russians frustrated the first and second attacks with searchlights. A third attempt was carefully made, and the Yuzuki sank a ship of the Borodino type and also hit others.

"During the night the Russians continued to move, and we preserved our enveloping movement some distance from the Russian position. The Russian ships headed northeast after daylight, hoping to reach Vladivostok.

"Our officers and men were determin-

ed that not a ship should escape and resolved not to relax their efforts until they had succeeded in either sinking or capturing every Russian ship.

"Our ships always kept ahead of the Russians. The battle was resumed at nine o'clock Sunday morning twelve miles east of Chiyuppon bay and lasted all day.

"Here the Russians suffered their heaviest losses. They seemed unprepared to repel night attacks.

"During our first night attack the Russians showed nine searchlights and frustrated the attacks, but clearly gave us the location of the fleet, which brought success later."

ADVERTISING TALKS.

Byron G. Moon Writes on "Methods of Retailing Furniture."

There are two distinct classes of furniture buyers. One class desires the most exclusive designs, the most staple materials and wish to pay for the goods when purchased.

The other class desires furniture as a necessity. They wish to secure it at the lowest price and wish any design of furniture that would look the best and wear the longest for the price. They also find it necessary either to buy a little at a time, or pay for it in easy instalments.

The first-class of furniture buyers, therefore, are people of means. The other class are those of limited means or people so situated that the question of fashion does not enter into their purchase.

An example of a furniture store which sells especially to the aristocratic trade is that of the Tobey Furniture Company, Chicago. This store advertises locally and in the national magazines, showing the most expensive patterns and materials. In their advertisements you will not seldom see a price quoted. The principle which runs through all their advertising is to show that their furniture is hand-made; that it gives elegance and distinction to any room. In other words, their advertising portrays that their goods are the selection for the most exclusive.

Their window displays show different pieces of furniture as they appear in the home. The arrangement of their show windows is not expected to suggest economy, but is for the purpose of showing the absolute fitness of things from the standpoint of good taste in furniture and surrounding decorations.

Hartman's is a good example of stores catering to the second class of trade mentioned. Their window displays all carry out the one idea of economy. As an example, their advertisements place special stress upon the fact that the four rooms can be furnished for specified price which appears to be ridiculously low. The same idea is carried out in the catch line, "Hartman's Feathers the Nest."

In connection with this line they have the illustration of a young married couple standing in the bird's nest.

They further advertise the convenience of their monthly payments and tell how easy it is for people of limited salaries to furnish their homes and pay for the furniture a little at a time.

The goods sold are not of exclusive pattern and of expensive materials, but tend to plain goods of staple materials and at popular prices.

In the display advertisements of such concerns black-faced type and head lines of an extravagant nature are used in connection with the advertisements of the former class mentioned. The reason for this is that the popular priced store must not only show that it has the goods you desire but that they will be sold at a price within your means and that "our payments" are such that it will be possible for you to purchase now.

The exclusive store, which must of course, appeal to a much more limited class of people, has only to show that the goods are high-class and exclusive. If the prospective purchasers are made to want the goods, the question of price and the payment is a very secondary matter.

You will also find a difference in the business of the two stores mentioned. Because of the demands of buyers in the smaller cities, there is a tendency in the manner of every man in the exclusive store which shows that he is catering to the whims and petty personalities of wealthy families.
