





Perritories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less. Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires he may, from top to bottom. Do not make the application to the Minister of the Interior. HOMESTEAD DUTIES A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to perform provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, unde one of the following plans:

(1) At lease six months' residence upo and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. (3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the


