A HEARTLESS THING IF MEDICAL HEALTH OFFICER WAS REMOVED,

So John McIntyre, K.C., Declared. An Unworthy Attempt to Do So Blocked by Mr. McIntyre, Capt. Gaskin and J. D. Thompson.

The board of health held its regular meeting yesterday afternoon. The chief topic of discussion was the removal of the city council's medical health officer being satisfactorily performed.

The medical health officer reported that during May there were two cases of typhoid fever in the city. Mr. Reeves asked if the medical health officer had examined the premises of J. O. Blake, on Wellington street, where there was a case.

The assistant medical health officer, Dr. Simmonds, said he could not go on forever. He advised Dr. Fee to resign and the board of health voted him the balance of the year's salary for faithful services.

When the council reference, concerning Dr. Fee, was read, Capt. Gaskin asked if any fault had been found with the performance of the medical health officer's duties.

Mr. Reeves stated that he had received a letter blackballing Dr. Fee. The letter contained something that the letter was alleged to have said concerning the speaker.

Dr. Hanley declared that no report had been made of the premises of J. O. Blake at whose house there was typhoid fever.

Chairman McIntyre said that if Mr. Blake's premises were filthy, he alone was responsible, and the police should be notified.

Mr. Reeves named over several promises that were unclear. The chairman said that these would be reported by the police, who were now making their annual inspection.

It was moved by Dr. Hanley and seconded by Mr. Reeves, that in reply to the request of the city council regarding the manner in which Dr. Fee is performing the duties of medical health officer, that this board report that Dr. Fee is not carrying out his duties of medical health officer.
