

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West, Ferritories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior. Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situated, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the visions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, unde one of the following plans : (1) At lease six months' residence upo and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. It is the practice of the Department to require a settler to bring 15 acres under cultivation, but if he prefers he may substitute stock; and 20 head of cattle, to be actually his own property, with buildings for heir accommodation, will be accepted instead of the cultivation (2) If the father (or mother, if the fa her is deceased), of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry unde the provisions of this act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land enters for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied

such person residing with the father or mother (3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homest the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in vicinity of the first homestead. (4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by hi

by residence upon the saidland. The term "vicinity" used seove tivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, wi or their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially feaced. The pr vilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duties upon their first homsteads to entitle, them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889. Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homsetead law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the commissioner of Dominion Lands at INFORMATION

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, in ormation as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge free of expenses, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in British Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa; the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoba; or to any of the Dominion Lands Agents in Manitoba or the North-West Territories.
