

The local government is disposed to clear the jails of all who occupy them as refuges. Some years ago it was proposed that every county should indigent poor, and it was understood that provincial aid would be generously extended to the counties which provided these institutions.

Some municipalities have homes for the poor, buildings suitably erected and equipped and grounds which capable, under tillage, of raising the vegetables that the inmates require and to spare.
