The United States is building up a great naval power; the secre tary's authority to act was unlimited the honor and glory of his position unsurpassed. Among the ancient gods, Mammon was one of the mightiest, and it would almost look as if Secretary Morton resigned his great office, to worship in "the temple of Mammon"; at any rate he has been the only man who could induce Mr. Hyde and President Alexander to part with their holdings.
