pose the Terms of Settlement special to the Whig. Paris, June 20.-Germany has consented to negotiate the Morocco question with France. The French government has indicated its willingness to neet the German demands in a most conciliatory spirit. An international conference may or may not follow, but if it does it will be on lines previous agreed upon by Germany and France, and will not open the whole question of the destiny of Morocco, as the sultan has expected it to do. France agrees that the status shall be maintained, and that the tan's sovereignty shall be unimpaired in a word, she is determined at al costs to avoid a war.
