Dr. Pyne, some time ago, made a report upon one of the Slocum preparations, called a "Psychic," which the company circulated in their literature, as a testimonial. He brought a suit against the company, but it has been brought to an end by the company agreeing to pay all costs of action, to destroy the testimonial and refrain from publishing it in the future.

ALARMING NUMBERS. Canadians Carried Off by Consumption. Toronto, June 20.-The appalling number of deaths from tuberculosis in this province is brought out in the figures of the monthly report of the Provincial Health department. For May, there were 196 deaths from this cause alone; 65 more than from all other contagious diseases. The total number of deaths in May was 2,148, a percentage of 18.1 per thousand against 13.7 last year.
