A NEW LAW MAY BE HELP-FUL NOW.

Fish Companies in the West Are Having Warm Time Over the Employment of Men-Case Now in Federal Courts.

scial to the Whig. Detroit, Mich., June 23 .- The loans and trust law, just signed by Governor Warner, will be quickly tested by the Booth Fish company, of Chicago, known as the "Fish Trust." who have practical control of the business all over Michigan and Cn-tario. Booth & Co. made contracts with various men in Michigan not to engage in the fish business for ten years. One was with a Detroit man who signed with the Wolverine Fish company, a rival of the Booths. The Booths got out an injunction restraining the man from working for the Wolverine. The latter claimed Booth contract was in contravention of the Michigan trust law. The Michigan supreme court upheld this view, the United States court of appeals knocked out the decision. With the new state law to back them the Wolverine will now move in the federal courts to dissolve the injunction, depriving them of the services of De-

### MAKING GOOD CHEESE.

First Essential is in Care of Cows and Milk.

Much of the dirt which may be seen on the cheese-cloth strainer and which dissolves and passes through-dandruff hairs, specks of dried manure, bacteria and the like that get into milk-falls in from above during the process of milking, writes a Vermont farmer in American Cultivator, Now, straining milk through cheese-cloth, only removes a part. The situation can bettered to a marked degree, keeping quality of milk enhanced and the like ihood that the milk will make butter be increased by attention to a few details that are neither costly in money or time or difficult to install. Wipe udder and abdomen with a damp cloth immediately before milk-

Provide milkers with clean clothes. Fill seams of dairy utensils with sol der and use some form of the sanitary are several forms of the latter. One is a pail covered with a "four" funnel a third and very practical pail is one with a shoulder and a hood, which is otherwise open. According as this is held the amount of dirt entering the pail may be cut down from sixty to ninety per cent.

If now, after the organisms have been thus excluded, their growth and multiplication are checked by low temperatures, one may feel fairly certain that the milk will have a lease of life almost as great as that of a ton of coal during a cold wave.
