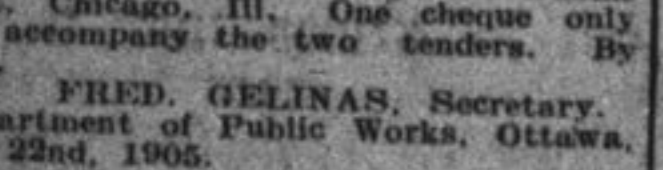

Canadians In England.

The old land has been sending to Canada some of its surplus population, and change of residence has affected many thousands. The percentage of business men who migrate is not so large as it may have seemed. The working element has been largely represented in the emigration, but not the capital or the brain that controls it.

The new land has sent to the old land not a few who have made a competency. It has not afforded many who have left the larger outlook, the field of promise, to engage in the activities of the mother country. The few who have transferred their service from Canada to England appear to have made their mark. Only recently reference was made to young Greenwood, the journalist, who went to the old land, and found himself immersed in its politics, first as an advocate of liberal principles, as against the monarchical programme of Chamberlain and Balfour, and later as a member of parliament. Now we have the record of another, a Canadian by birth and education, and for many years a leader of the people, J. Allen Baker, a cousin of J. F. Baker, of this city.

The Globe prints a most complimentary article in which Mr. Baker is described as "a distinguished Canadian." Mr. Baker's candidature in East Finbury last week, when the polling takes place, is confidently expected. His address to the electors, and dealing with reforms that affect the people socially, commercially and politically, is decidedly refreshing, and stamps the quality of the man's mind and independence.

World's Sunday Schools.

Of all the conventions of the year, of a religious character, the greatest, to meet in Canada, is that in connection with the International Sunday School Association. It is now in progress in Toronto and represents, in its membership, its work, its results, the best in Sunday school life.

The advantage of the convention is apparent. Its leaders are men and women of advanced ideas, of scholarship, tact, judgment, and diplomacy. They are not only enthusiasts, who have carried their spirit into every walk and condition of life, but educators, and they possess the faculty of transmitting much of what they learn to others.

Here, at this great gathering of nearly two thousand persons—some from far distant lands—there is the intellect, the intelligence, the business acumen. These are behind the organization, and it represents many thousands of teachers and preachers, and readers that number over twenty millions. Here are the normal and primary teachers, the specialists, the field workers, the literati whose combined energies have served to give the Sunday school movement the impulse that has carried it to success.

A year ago the International Association met in Jerusalem, and the fact of its meeting in that holy city was most interesting to the visitors to historic points and the educational by the lectures on board of ship. As for Jerusalem there was stored with in it the memories of sacred events, and impressions were made that will remain and move the masses as they read the books the voyage has produced and absorb the information they contain.

A Wait From England.

Lord Dundonald, in England, criticizes the Canadian militia system, and personally attacks the minister of militia. He does not think much of the council—formed, as it is, after the council in England—and says that whatever it may be its dominating personality will be Sir Frederick Borden. The minister of militia takes care of himself. He has been recognized as an active head of his department and he knows what is going on, and properly so, as he may be expected, any day, to explain it in parliament.

My lord recalls something that was told him by an officer in the Canadian service—that promotions in it were subject to the minister's approval. There can be no objection to that so long as the promotions are worthy and commendable. It cannot be said that all the men who are rising in office and distinction are political friends and allies of the government.

The fact is that of the changes which followed the formation of the military council, the larger number affected men who are not now, and never were, supporters of the liberal government. The insinuation, therefore, that only political favourites could get recognition under Sir Frederick Borden has not been sustained.

Finally it is alleged that the disrepute in which the Canadian militia is held is shown by the fact that of the large number of graduates from the Royal Military College annually, "not one will accept a position in the service." Not one? Why there are many in the departments at Ottawa and holding commissions in other places, some in the permanent corps and others in the corps which are called out at this season for annual drill. All Royal Military College graduates cannot find employment in the military service. It was never designed that they should. The curriculum has been changed so that the young men can qualify for the civil service, while receiving a training which will qualify them for commands in the militia should they be required.

The wails of my lord are, therefore, untimely. They indicate the revengeful spirit which was not supposed to be a characteristic of his make-up. The Dundonald incident was supposed to be closed. The pity is that it has been re-opened.

A REAL MARINE MYSTERY. Where Lies "Sir Wilfrid?"—Retard When Found. Toronto World. Was it the wreck of the dredge Sir Wilfrid Laurier that the crew and captain Stephenson, of the R. & O. steamer Hamilton, saw as they were steaming past a point five miles from Port Hope and three miles from the shore? They are almost positive that it was.

The loss of the Sir Wilfrid three years ago was peculiar. With her tug she was riding through a heavy sea and in some way was lost. Search was made for her, but no trace could be found. The value of the dredge was \$65,000, and even though sunk its value remains about the same. In the three years that have elapsed the Polish company and the insurance companies interested have made industrious search to locate her. Thousands of dollars in the hire of searching parties, divers and boats have been spent to obtain a trace of the lost dredge, but nothing has ever come of it. Report after report of the sighting of the boat has been proved untrue.

Should Capt. Stephenson be able to point out the spot where she lies on the bottom of Lake Ontario he will receive a large standing reward offered for any person that can give information leading to the ultimate recovery of the dredge.
