Kaiser Is Not Quite So Belligerent.

HAS TAKEN POSITION BEHIND

FRANCE. Negotiations Are Likely to Result in Reaching Basis of An Agreement-The

Chief Danger to Peace. Special to the Whig. London, June 28.-While it is cult to reconcile the Berlin and Paris versions of Germany's reply to the French note, there seems to be justification for the inference that the kaiser has considerably modified his belligerent attitude. This is undoubtedly due to the decisive stand taken by Great Britain in support of French position. It must not be inferred that German ambitions will be abandoned, but it is hoped they will be considerably modified, and, perhaps, turned in another direction. The situation is still extremely delicate, but advices from Berlin and Paris agree that the present negotiations are likely to result in reaching a basis of an

The Berlin correspondent of the Express says that President Roosevelt, at Emperor Williams' request, intervened in the Morocco controversy to the extent of advising Great Britain to aid in the interests of peace. Germany represented to Washington that the attitude of Great Britain and the aggressive language of British press in inviting France to defy Germany constituted the chief danger of peace.

FLOATING MACHINE SHOP Novel Craft Anchored Near Clay-

Clayton, N.Y., June 27 .- A floatin machine shop is the latest novelty or the broad St. Lawren e and as a peer. R. W. Whipple, Binghamton, an expert machinist, devised the scheme, and placed it in operation a

Whipple came to Clayton to rent suitable building to serve as a reboats a few weeks ago. He sought in vain for acceptable quarters, then decided to build his own shop where no landlord could collect the rent. Under his direction workmen constructed a huge raft and on it placed a commodious structure equipped with all of the latest repair tools. About each side of the floating garage is a dock five feet wide, sur mounted by a rail and containing rings for securing boats. Repairs are

made on this dock. Whipple has stationed his boat of Clayton and says that as soon as ousiness is dull at this point he wil float his shop to more lucrative fields.
