FIRST DOMINION DAY MAKES MEN SOUND AND STRONG

HOW IT WAS OBSERVED AT KINGSTON.

The Imperial Troops Engaged in A Sham Fight—Proclamation Read on Market Square by Mayor Breden.

The first of July, 1867 (first Dominion day), opened bright and fair and was ushered in at Kingston by a salute of twenty-one guns, fired by the Royal Artillery from Point Frederick, and joyous peals from all the bells of the city. The people were early astir decorating their houses with branches of maple leaves. Every where branches of maple were visible and the city presented a gala appearance.

At ten o'clock all the imperial troops in garrison were drawn up on old historic Battlefield common for a grand review, after which one of the most sham battles ever seen here occurred. The sailors of the royal navy with their gunboats engaged in the battle from Navy Bay and put the troops hors de combat.

At noon all the troops, consisting of the Royal Canadian Rifles, under command of Lieut.-Col. Moffatt; the Royal Artillery, under command of Col. Gibson, commanding of the garrison, and the Kingston Field Battery, were drawn up on one side of the market square, while the rest of the space were densely packed with visitors and citizens. From a raised platform in the centre, Mayor John Breden, surrounded by the members of the city council and leading citizens, read the royal proclamation, proclaiming the Dominion of Canada, which was received with demonstration of joy and applause by the people. The bells again rang out, and the blue jackets on the gunboats fired a royal salute opposite the City hall a royal salute opposite the market battery, and the new dominion flag was raised on all the public buildings.

In the afternoon an immense procession of the different societies and fire brigades, escorted, the city council and Mayor Breden, wearing his chain of office, bringing up the rear. At night the city was brilliantly illumined and a magnificent display of fireworks concluded the festivities.

At Ottawa the first cabinet of the Dominion of Canada was inaugurated the various members taking the oath of office in presence of Lord Monk, the first viceroy of the new Dominion of Canada.

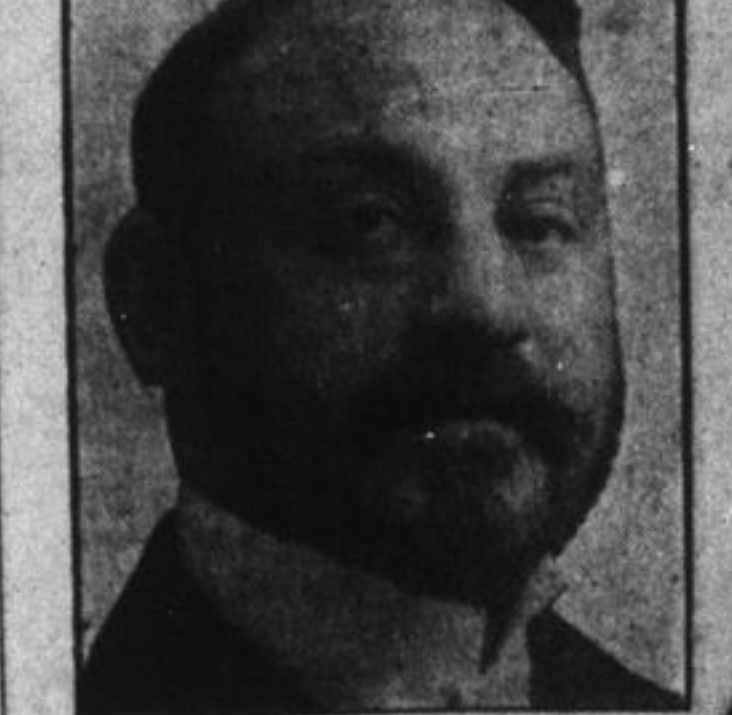
