COMMERCIAL MATTERS. What Is Going On In the Busines World-The Markets. Failures in Canada for past week, 20

The ships of the world are insured for total of £950,000,000. Wheat is reported to be two feet high o Unnora and Swan River districts, and in Canora and Swan River districts, and at Roland it measures eighteen inches, and is very thick and heavy.

Dividends payable at the period in Canada total about \$1,575,000, apart from dividends on bonds, which would bring the total well over \$2,000,000.

The sockeye salmon are beginning to run on the British Columbia const. The big catch which occurs once every four years is expected to be made this scason. Gross earnings of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company for the eleven months ending May 31 averaged over \$4.186,000 per month. Net earnings averaged about \$1,270,000.

The value of imports entering the port of New York, for the last twelve munths exceed by nearly \$50,000,000 the entries of last year. The total imports approximate \$649,000,000, as compared with \$599,900,498 the previous year. All things considered customs officials say the year has been the most prosperous so far as imports are conterned in the history of the pert of New York.

Statistics covering last year's ship, ments of Canadian and U.S. sheep and cattle to treat Britain have just been issued by the British Board of Agriculture. They show that during 1904 Canada sent 146,599 cattle and 77,835 sheep as against 190,815 cattle and 83,291 sheep in the previous year. The U.S. sent 401,250 cattle and 294,804 sheep against 301,756 cattle and 171,386 sheep during 1903. Liverpool received by far the largest part of the shipments from both countries.


