HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of afamily, or any male over 18 years of age

to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less, ENTRY O'Connor, were entertained to dinner, at the officers mess at camp last evening.

Powerful Tugs and Strong Coning.

Which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration. Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situated, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments thereto, to perform

the conditions connected therewith, unde one of the following plans:

(1) At lease six months' residence upo and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. It is the practice of the Department to require settler to bring 15 acres under cultivation, but if he prefers he may substitute morning, at nine o'clock, at the entrance to the port of Sidi Abdallah,
Tunis, under the following circumstances:

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased), of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entere for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead the requirements of this act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead. (4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the saidland. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township, or an adjoining of cornering township. A


