



Canada And Her Defences. The Canadian army is growing. It is now a formidable affair, compared with the army of some years ago, and it will take on greater proportions when the garrisoning of Halifax and Esquimalt has been completed.

When the colonial conference occurred in 1902, it was urged that Canada should contribute to the cost of the army and navy. This was the first practical step towards that the colonies and the mother country. Canada took time to think over the proposition. 
