THE CITY COUNCIL

LAST REGULAR MEETING BEFORE VACATION.

Collegiate By-Law Passed—Ald. Mowat's Explanation Regarding a Statement of the Mayor—Many By-Laws Passed.

At the city council meeting last evening there were present the mayor and Ald. Agnew, Bell, Carson, Givens, Harkness, Hong, Johnston, Kent, Mallen, McCann, Mowat, Ross, Sands, Sears, and Toyn.

Communications. J. S. Potter, for remission of taxes for 1905, on "Sailors' Snug Harbor. Referred to Finance Committee.

Petitions. W. S. Gordon, and others, for an artificial stone walk on Albert street. Granted.

The Finance Report. Besides recommending payment of a large number of accounts, the finance report made these recommendations:

On the communication of W. King, asking for increased remuneration for the collection of arrears of taxes for the years, 1901, 1902 and 1903, the committee deems it inadvisable to alter the terms of the contract entered into with Mr. King.

On the communication of J. M. Strange, that in view of the fact that he was assessed for cash in the bank before he had had a reasonable time to invest it, and as the committee is unaware that such an assessment was ever made in the city before, that \$100 be remitted from his taxes for 1905.
