THE 5 P. M. EDITION. DAMAGE ACTIONS ENTERED BY MONTREAL WOMEN.

One Action is Against C.P.R. the Other Against a Montreal Contractor—One for \$15,000 the Other for \$5,000.

Special to the Whig. Montreal, July 27.—Incenzo Ferraro, has entered an action against the Canadian Pacific railroad for \$5,000 damages for the loss to herself and children of her husband, who was killed outright, a year ago by a hand-car of the company near Mattawa.

An in forma pauperis action for \$15,000 has been entered by Madame Pelletier against Thomas Forde, contractor, for damages for the loss of her husband, while employed by the defendant, met his death about three months ago, while working on a building. Some wood fell on his head, and as a result of this he died.

William G. Schardt, Chicago, general secretary of Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners, arrived in the city yesterday, and lost no time in meeting the employers. After having had several interviews with leading contractors and builders, Mr. Schardt expressed the opinion that the strike would be amenable to settlement at the end of week. It is expected that there will be a little give and take on both sides.

The Allied line steamship Corinthian, while making her way out of port, early this morning, on her way to Liverpool, went aground on the St. Helen's Island shoal, opposite the city. The accident was caused by the parting of the tow line of the tug which had her by the bow, and before the vessel could get straightened out in the rapid current she had gone aground. It is not believed that she will have sustained any damage, though owing to the swift current running in the neighborhood of the shoal, her release is a matter of some difficulty. She has a general cargo, sixty-nine cattle on board, and five passengers. The cattle are being loaded in order to lighten forward.

DR. MEACHAM DEAD. He Was Formerly Member for Lennox.

To Stop Smuggling. New York, July 27.—The custom house authorities intend to take active measures to put a stop to the smuggling of tobacco at Bayonne, N. J., where on Saturday, twenty-seven bales of Samatra tobacco, valued at \$2,000, were seized in the house of a woman who is said to be the agent of a gang of smugglers. The vessel on which the tobacco came is the steamer Diamant of the Standard Oil company.

Nan's Sister Has Government Job. Washington, July 27.—Mrs. Harriet P. Powell, a sister of Nan Patterson, has been appointed to a position in the bureau of engraving and printing and entered on her duties there last night. She took the civil service examination and began work as a plate printer assistant at \$1.25 per day.

Kingston, July 27.—The Eronteno Cheese Board met this afternoon in the Whig Hall. The bidding was opened by Mr. McKinnon at 10c, and raised by Mr. Alexander to 10 1/2c. The following factories offered goods for sale:

PROPERTY OWNERS. Have Some Rights Against Railway Companies.

Toronto, July 27.—The right of a railway company to carry on construction work through private property, irrespective of the wishes of the property owner, was involved in a case before single court, in Osgoode Hall, to-day. In double tracking its line near London, the Grand Trunk ran through the farm of Anthony Dickey and the railway desired to move a bridge which gave Dickey access from one part of his farm to the other. Dickey objected to this, and also to several plans that were submitted to him for alternative bridges. To-day he obtained an injunction restraining the Grand Trunk from removing the bridge unless an order was obtained from the railway commission.
