### THEY HAVE ERRED

SOME AMUSING MISTAKES MADE BY PAPERS.

Even the "Thunderer" Went Astray a Few Days Ago—Other Papers Occasionally Make Blunders.

"The man who never makes a mistake never makes anything—not even if he is a reporter. And, unquestionably, you do occasionally see some funny stunts in the serious newspapers. Recently, for instance, during the hearing of an action brought by a 'Gibson Girl' chorus lady against a London theatre manager, Justice Darling asked her what were the lines she had to say in 'The Catch of the Sea-son.' 'I'm a perfect wonder at spotting winners,' was her reply, 'and I hardly ever lost at bridge.'"

The Daily Mail, the Telegraph, the Standard, and most of the other London papers, reported the answer correctly; but the Times, which is supposed never to make a mistake, and never to apologize when it makes one, reported the Gibson Girl's reply as: 'I'm a perfect wonder at hugging widows, and I hardly ever lose a breach.' This is much like a statement made in a German newspaper concerning Prince Bismarck. The writer was referring to the endeavors of the great statesman to maintain good terms with all the powers, but he was made to say, by the substitution of the word 'mudchen' girls, for 'mudchen,' powers—Prince Bismarck is trying to 'maintain good relations with all the girls.'"

But Bismarck is by no means the only statesman who has been egregiously reported by some of the newspapers. In a famous speech, Sir William Harcourt exclaimed: 'Great is Diana of the Ephesians.' One day when he read his favorite newspaper at breakfast the next morning he discovered himself as having said: 'Great Diana! What a larer it is!' Mr. Chamberlain, too, has often been the victim of the reporter's persistent industry. 'I feel like Figaro in 'Beaumarchais,' he said on one occasion while addressing an audience. His pronunciation, it is true, may have been at fault, though most of the newspapers correctly reported him. One of them, however, took occasion to differ, and when his speech appeared, it was reported to have said, 'I feel like Figaro in the Bon Marche.'"

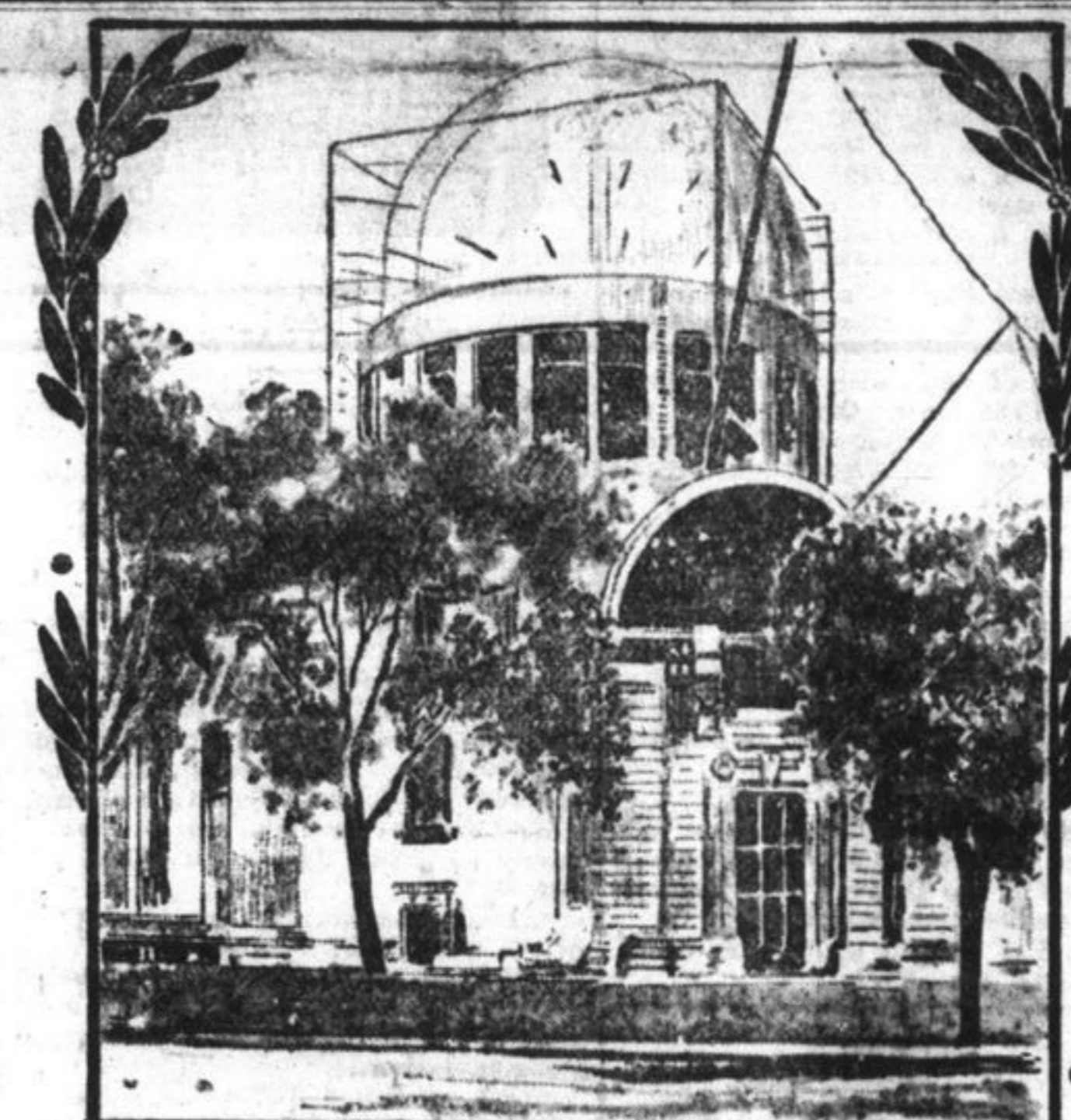

### NEWS OF CHURCHES

THE VARIOUS DOINGS IN THE RELIGIOUS WORLD.

An Offer Made to the Southern Presbyterians—A Monument to Columbus at Rome—Christians Maintain the Hospitals.

Rev. W. E. Brickman, Philadelphia, has accepted a call to the New Jerusalem Temple, Berlin.

The Baptist church, Belleville, unanimously decided to extend a call to the Rev. Charles H. Emerson, of Dutton, Ont.

Rev. A. F. McGregor has accepted the call to St. Andrew's church, Niagara-on-the-Lake. He will be inducted July 31st.

Rev. A. McAlay, who is leaving Mitchell for Ladder, B.C., was presented with a purse of gold, a Bible and an address.

Professor Selmi, the last surviving teacher of the present pope, when the latter was a student at the seminary of Treviso, died recently at Padua.

Rev. W. S. Wright has resigned the pastorate of Newcastle and Newtonville churches, Presbyterian. He will attend College at Glasgow, Scotland.

Discernment settlements are increasing in number and growing in favor. Chicago has a great enterprise of the kind, also Washington and Cleveland.

The Catholics of Ireland have about twice as many clergymen to support as Protestants, and no land in Europe can equal Ireland in its number of bishops and archbishops.

A layman of the Southern American Presbyterian church in Atlanta, Ga., has offered to give \$100,000 to its ministerial relief fund on condition that the denomination raise \$25,000.

Rev. H. B. Horne, Chalmers church, Elora, has tendered his resignation as pastor of the church. A movement is now on foot for the union of the two Presbyterian churches in that place.

Of the 981 missionaries on the roll of the Church Mission Society 101 pay their own expenses, and 471 others are supported in whole or in part independently of the treasury of the society.

Rev. J. A. McKenzie, pastor of the Presbyterian church, Beverly, has accepted a call to Knox, St. John's, N.S. Mr. McKenzie will leave for his new field of labor the first week in August.

A falling off in the number of students preparing for the ministry is reported to England. There has also been a marked decrease in the number of theological students at the German universities.

Cardinal Richelmy is endeavoring to raise funds for the erection of a monument to Christopher Columbus in the neighborhood of St. Peter's, Rome, to commemorate the 400th anniversary of the great discoverer's death.

Union Theological Seminary, while nominally under Presbyterian control, is considered now to be as free as Harvard Divinity School. Tufts College is also about as liberal in its divine school as Harvard or Union.

Rev. J. E. Rattenberg, of Nottingham, Eng., has been described as a second 'Hugh Price Hughes.' He has attracted considerable attention by his vigorous speeches in favour of an institutional and democratic church.

The total number of American Congregational churches as shown in the new Year Book is 6,476. This includes 37 foreign missionary churches of the American board. The total of church members, inclusive of 63,178 members of foreign mission churches, is 730,809.

Since the consummation of the Methodist union in America the membership there has, of course, not been included in the returns. The spiritual prosperity this year has been shared by all the districts. South Wales leads the way with 592 net increase.

New headquarters have just been provided for the Church Army of England. The building, which is of red brick, and cost \$250,000, is situated in Marble Arch, London. It was formally opened by Princess Louise Augusta of Schleswig-Holstein, and the chief speaker was Field Marshal Lord Roberts.

Rev. Dr. Briggs, who has been for some time in Rome, believes that the pope promises to become a great reformer; that 'great reforms are in his mind, which are long will become evident in fact.' Dr. Briggs believes that the Roman church has in it 'the promise of a reformation that would amount almost to transformation.'

At the present time there is not a single hospital in the Chinese empire founded and maintained by the native people. Such institutions are found only where Christian missions are at work, with the exception of two or three small hospitals are maintained by the foreign population exclusively for the treatment of their countrymen.
