# CAN CALL ALL ANIMALS

REMARKABLE INSTANCES OF THE USE OF A RARE FACULTY.  
Manitoba Led One of the Most Accomplished Imitators of Animals Ever Met By the Observant Lt. Col. Andrew Haggard—Indians Best Teachers—Abyssinian's Imitations That Betrayed a Lion Hunter.

The art of deceiving wild animals by imitation of their cries is a very primitive one, practiced by savages in all countries as a means of procuring food. Many white men excel in "calling" animals and birds, notably the moose among the larger animals, but if inquiry could be carried far enough it would probably be found, writes Lt. Col. Andrew Haggard in Forest and Stream, that the most skillful over their aptitude in this respect to the teachings of untutored savages, whose lives depend upon the exercise of this gift.

After supper, as we were sitting by the campfire in the shade of an overhanging rock, the conversation turned to the art of calling may, but in the art of using the "stare pipe," which imitates the voice of the hare. This was employed largely in England in the time of the fox-hunt, and made a penal offence in somewhat more modern days when utilized by poachers in the pursuit of their nefarious occupation.

A young lad in the wilds of Northern Manitoba was one of the most remarkable imitators of animals whom I ever met. My young friend had been instructed from his earliest youth by a Swampy Indian in the art of imitating result that, at the age of 15, he could call any tame or wild animal about the backwoods settlement where the Indian's father, he and I used to drive together out on the prairie, and some rusty Indians, in search of ducks and geese, which abounded. The animals harnessed to the buckboard were mare, each of which had a foal, and these maras used to call to follow the buckboard, cantering along behind.

Never shall I forget my astonishment one evening when, after having driven a few hundred yards from the Indian's Bay post, his father suddenly stopped the mare, saying: "Raa, the foals have stopped behind, call them." Instantly the lad commenced whinnying exactly like a mare. He repeated the cry several times, ending up on each occasion with two or three little natural snorts. The imitation was so exact that the maras, who were fast asleep, received and came galloping up to join us, but it was almost impossible to believe that it was not one of the maras that he called them.

One evening just out shooting prairie chicken night fell upon us before we got back to the wagon, to the wheels of which we had failed to attach the maras properly. One of them we found crouched near the camp, as if he were waiting for us to be captured, and as it was a wet, misty night, not a sign of her was to be seen anywhere. Then it was that the boy, accompanied by his father, called for while his father and I remained by the buckboard the youth sallied forth into the foggy darkness, making a sound to imitate the voice of a foal. He was absent for half an hour, but returned triumphant with the missing mare.

The way that boy could also imitate ducks and geese was simply marvelous. Well do I remember a trip he played one evening in the reeds. He had joined me, unknown to his father, who was standing about fifty yards away in the tall reeds, waiting for the wild fowl, which did not come. Crouching down by his side, so that he could watch his parent, the mischievous youth several times imitated the cry of wild geese at a distance, then he made them seem nearer, until apparently overhead. The old sportsman was instantly on the alert, craning his neck and peering in all directions for the fowl. At last, frantic at not being able to see them, the old man shouted out to me, wildly: "Where are the geese? Where are they?" "Here, father," answered the boy, rising from the reeds and bursting into a roar of laughter.

# NEWEST SHIP IN FLEET

FEATURES OF THE "TRIUMPH" AS DESCRIBED BY THE ENGINEER.  
Britain's Latest Type of Battleship Shows Various Alterations — Electricity Employed Wherever Possible — A Great Battery Containing Ten 7.5 Inch Guns On the Main Deck—How Economy of Space is Effected.

The great length of the Triumph, 425 feet between perpendiculars, is very observable as one approaches her when aloft, and gives the impression of a somewhat low freeboard. Such, however, is not really characteristic of this war vessel. Her freeboard at the bow is 21 feet 6 in., but as she has a rising sheer aft, the freeboard at the stern is 19 feet 6 in., and the height of the centres of the two 10-inch guns forward above the main waterline is 23 feet 4 inches, the corresponding centre height aft being only two feet less. The height of centres of the main deck battery 7.5-inch guns is 13 feet 2 inches, or rather more than that of the main deck battery 4-inch guns of the King Edward VII, making, however, the angle of heel required to bring the centre of the muzzles to water level rather less than that of the latter named ship. In consequence, of course, of the much greater length of the 7.5-inch guns.

Great Gun Battery.  
A striking feature of the Triumph is the main deck open battery, containing ten 7.5-inch guns. It is enclosed by 2-inch Krupp armor on the sides, and 4-inch guns of the King Edward VII, making, however, the angle of heel required to bring the centre of the muzzles to water level rather less than that of the latter named ship. In consequence, of course, of the much greater length of the 7.5-inch guns.

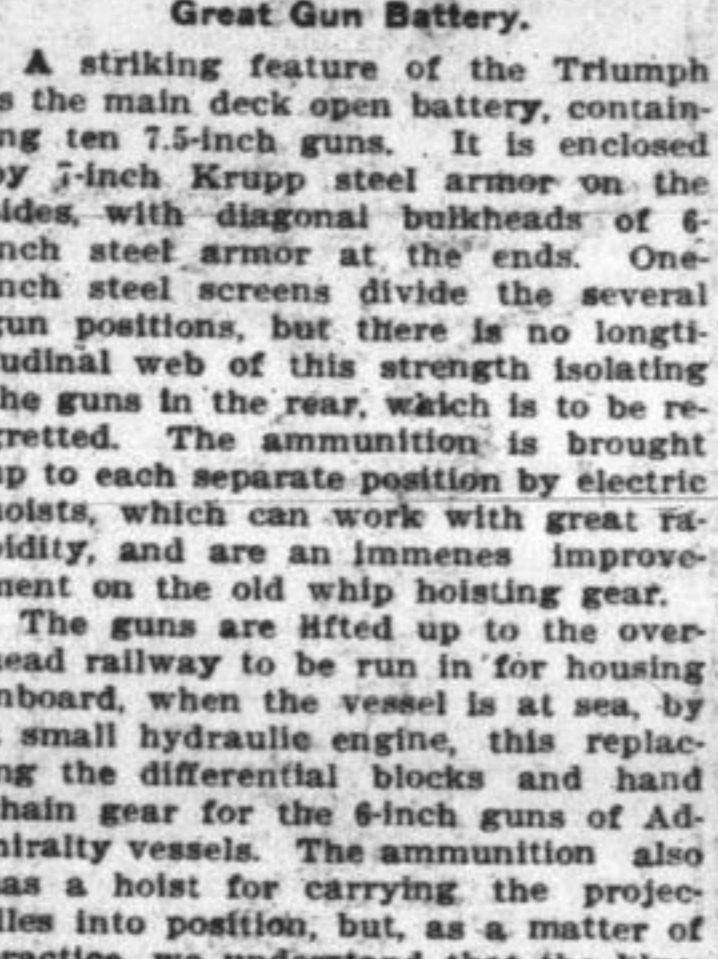
