NEWS OF THE WORLD
OCCURRENCES RECOUNTED IN BRIEF FORM.
Matters That Interest Everybody
 —Notes From All Over—Little Of Everything Easily Read And Remembered.
 Saratoga, N.Y., now has two full-fledged gambling joints in operation. So far this year Winnipeg building permits aggregate in value \$7,700,000. Heat must be reported to be general in the wheat fields around Hartney, Man.
 A Grimby woman was drugged and detained in a disreputable resort in Tonawanda.
 Gen. Stoessel has been relieved of his command of the Third Siberian Army Corps.
 A New York girl fell three stories, but alighted on a clothesline and saved her life.
 A G.T.P. surveyor named Deschene has been lost in the wilds north of Sturgeon Lake.
 Sheriff Brown, of Elgin county, has been removed from office. Dugald McColl succeeds him.
 The London Times' commercial review says that the trade reports are more encouraging.
 The czar refused Grand Duke Cyril permission to marry the divorced Grand Duchess of Hesse.
 There have been 283 cases of yellow fever in New Orleans and two suspected cases in New York.
 An unknown man, sitting on the track near Blackwater Junction, was struck by a train and killed.
 Elizabeth McElroy, seventy, sues Michael McElroy, eighty, for divorce, in Denver. They were married a year ago.
 The legacy of \$20,000 left by the late Hon. James Sutherland to the Woodstock hospital has been paid over.
 Skin grafting will have to be performed on sixteen of the wounded men in the disaster on the gunboat Bennington.
 American lumber manufacturers will raise \$150,000 for the endowment of a chair of applied forestry at Yale University.
 By the discharge of a shotgun Charles E. George, Toronto, had the side of his head blown off, killing him instantly.
 At New York on Saturday nearly a score of yellow fever suspects were advanced in wages.
 A strike of 60,000 Lancashire cotton operatives is threatened, owing to the masters' refusal of a five per cent. advance in wages.
 An excursion steamer on Lake Hopatonehony, N.J., struck a rock and sank, and her 120 passengers were rescued just in time.
 The Zionist congress at Basel, Switzerland, declined Great Britain's offer of a tract of land in East Africa for a Zionist colony.
 Big rewards offered at Detroit for the murderers of Pawnee broker Joseph Meyer, found in his shop with his skull beaten to pieces.
 E. H. Harriman, the railroad magnate, is reported to be thinking of going to the Philippines to investigate railway conditions.
 William Glidden, chief accountant of the Dominion government printing bureau, is to be superannuated after thirty-four years' service.
 The "Cannonball" express on the St. Louis, Iron Mountain & Southern railroad was wrecked at Diaz, Ark., and two men were killed.
 It is the determination of both the president and Secretary Wilson to clear the United States department of Agriculture of every form of "grafting."
 Canadian owners are arranging to develop the Athabasca iron areas, with a view to shipping 500,000 tons of ore per year to the United States.
 Japan comes to the Washington conference assured that whatever her peace terms they will have the sympathetic approval of Great Britain.
 Russia says the capture of the British steamer Oldhamia, was on account of the presence of contraband either shells or machinery, in her cargo.
 Alderman Coatsworth stands positively that he will be a candidate for the Toronto mayoralty next January, no matter who else may be in the field.
 Jessie Jane Turner, formerly of Aylmer, has notified her friends that she will marry Adolphus Porter, a colored restaurant keeper in Chicago, because she loves him.
 Mrs. L. L. Leppard, Philadelphia, a week ago, had her scalp torn off in an accident. Friday doctors successfully grafted a new one on her skull. Then she died.
 John McNaughton, Finch, Ont., nearly lost his life by being gored by a vicious bull. He was putting up the bars of the pasture gate when the animal charged him.
 As a defender of the Canada's Cup, the yacht Inoquois, a Herreshoff boat of Rochester, N.Y., has been selected. Lorie G. Mabbett will be captain of the Inoquois for the races.
 The London Daily Telegraph makes the authoritative announcement that parliament will not be dissolved this year unless the government is again defeated before prorogation.
 Alex. M. Hall, formerly of Cornwall, is reported to have been shot by a drunken miner. Mr. Hall is superintendent of a mine at Big Stone Gap, W. Va. The wound is not serious.
 During a thunderstorm of terrific intensity on Sunday five persons were struck by lightning and instantly killed and nine were seriously injured at the Parkway baths at Coney Island.
