The Chinese merchants and gentry of three provinces have consented to raise the capital necessary to indemnify the present owners and to carry on the undertaking.

To Make Exploration. Berlin, Aug. 3.—A scientific expedition will leave this city next week for a voyage of exploration in Turkestan, the desert adjoining Tibet. The expedition is financed by the German government, and has for its object the exploration of the Chinese part of that territory, in which immense treasures of ancient civilization are said to be hidden.

The last expedition under the direction of Brunwede succeeded in bringing to Berlin museums an important collection of statues, paintings, and manuscripts, from ancient monuments which are said to have existed there before the Turkish domination and which are known to have flourished in the 14th century.

SUIT AFTER A WAR

LABEL ALLEGED BY HOWARD S. FOLGER.

W. L. Visger and G. W. Cooper Accused of Printing Statements Damaging to Thousand Island Steamboat Company.

Clayton, N.Y., Aug. 3.—A legal suit, alleged criminal libel, has been started by Howard S. Folger, general manager of the Thousand Islands Steamboat company, against Walter L. Visger, manager of the Capt. Visger Steamboat line, and George W. Cooper, of Syracuse and Thousand Island Park, asking damages for literature alleged to have been issued and circulated by the defendants at the various resorts of the Thousand Islands during the past week.

The statements complained against were printed on small handbills. The papers in the action are being prepared by Purcell, Burns & Purcell, of Watertown, N.Y., attorneys for the plaintiff, and according to the statements made by General Manager Howard S. Folger, of the Thousand Islands Steamboat company, a Post-Standard reporter last evening, will be served at once upon the defendants. The damages that will be demanded by the plaintiff have not yet been fixed but will probably reach into the thousands.

The handbill on which the ground for the action rests casts reflection, it is claimed, upon the safety of the vessels of the Thousand Islands Steamboat company and their fitness for public service.

The suit is the result of a rate war which has been raging on the river during the past two weeks and which has resulted in bargain day excursions on all of the yachts taking the island rambles.

Capt. Visger, of the Capt. Visger Steamboat line, and General Manager Folger, of the Thousand Islands Steamboat company, have agreed to the same terms, to twenty-five cents, one-half of the regular rate. The Thousand Islands Steamboat company, in its announcement of bargain rates, issued a circular reading "Bargain Day Excursions and the Reason Why Not."
