MILITARY MATTERS. NEWS FOR THE KINGSTON GARRISON. A Time Honored, But Useless Phrase to Be Discarded Hereafter—Aids to Shooting Should Not Be Allowed on Ranges.

In connection with the "Old Boys" celebration in London, Ont., on August 9th, there is to be a military day. In the programme arranged for this particular day there are sixteen events.

A familiar expression in military life has, after more than a century of usefulness, been at last discarded. Everyone who has ever worn the king's uniform, is familiar with the way in which orders, whether "general" or "regimental," are issued and conclude. Though they always begin in this fashion, "garrison" (or as the case may be), "orders by Maj.-Gen. Blank," and the like, the success of the order, after years concluding "By order," signed by the adjutant general, his deputy or by the regimental adjutant according to circumstances.

Not many years will roll by ere it will be a necessary part of every officer's knowledge to be qualified in signalling. And rightly so. According to the ethics of modern warfare, signalling plays just as important a part on the battlefield as ability to shoot straight, and one should not be overlooked any more than the other. Signalling at long distance is taking the place of bugle calls at short distances, and a steady advance of long distance signalling will be a further step in the evolution of the art.

Some time ago it was suggested that Kingston had a possible chance of securing the permanent military camp, Gen. Lat. is being given every entire ground here and found it suitable. Other places in Ontario and Quebec possessing eligible camp sites have for a year past, been bombarding Ottawa with deputations in the interests of their respective "town lots." Kingston stirred a hand towards warding the claims of the local site? That old adage, "everything comes to him who waits," was long ago exemplified in the individual who gets out and hustles who carries off the premium.

A militia order issued contains the following with reference to the granting of leave of absence to members of departmental services. Leave of absence up to three days will be given by the district officer commanding, or the officer holding the command. All applications for leave, in excess of three days, will be forwarded by the officer commanding the district, with his recommendation or otherwise, for the sanction of the adjutant-general for military service and the adjutant-general for army service and the adjutant-general for the master-general of ordnance for engineer services.

Rumor has it that at an early date the name of Sgt. Maj. Long, W.D., will appear on the list of commissioned officers. At present Mr. Long is in Ottawa, on duty at militia headquarters. It is said he will soon be transferred to Halifax, to succeed along under Col. Trury. Sgt. Maj. Long is a clever soldier, who possesses high qualifications and his translation to the commissioned ranks would be a great acquisition to the artillery branch of the Canadian militia.

According to the new establishment, a riding master is to be appointed, with commissioned rank, to have charge of equitation relating to the Royal Military College and the local militia corps. The name of Sergeant-Gilbert is mentioned in connection with the appointment, and no better man could be obtained for the position. His qualification is unsurpassed and his ability unquestioned.

THE PRODUCE MARKET. Remarkably High Prices for Cheese and Butter. The Canadian produce market is certainly holding its own against the wheat market in the matter of high prices, and at the different country boards this week touched the highest prices of the season. This seems all the more surprising because it is just the period of the season when the offerings are very large. As high as 11 1/2c. to 11 5/16c. was paid in the country for finest Ontario cheese, while at Cowansville, Que., butter sold as high as 23c., and at St. Hyacinthe, 22c. was paid, the highest price of the season so far.

There is no doubt keen competition for the offerings, and some of the biggest buyers in the trade are apparently ready to pay the high prices demanded. There is no doubt, too, that there has been considerable short covering and this has helped to stiffen prices. The interesting question now is to what length the English market will follow the advance in Canada. There has been a fairly active and speculative demand on the other side, and the English market shows a stronger tendency, unless showing a sharp advance, but the fact cannot be lost sight of that the carrying of prices to too high a level would interfere with consumption, and that this would in all probability result in a break in prices.

The Canadian producer is now obtaining higher prices for his product than he has since 1903, which was a banner year for the Canadian producer. In that year as high as 13c. a pound was obtained, and the country for cheese, and the exports for the season represented a return to the Canadian dairymen of \$21,563,388.

The course of prices in 1903, however, was different to what the course of prices in Canada this season, so far. The highest prices of the season of 1903 ruled in the primary month of the season, May, but before the end of June values had fallen to 10c., and in July there was a further weakening to 9c., which was the bottom price of the season for finest Ontario. Before the end of August, values had once more risen to 10c., a point to which they are steadily advanced after that until in September factorymen realized as high as 12c. for finest fat cheese. This advance was followed by a reaction, which again carried prices down to 9c. The course of prices so far during the present season have been consistently strong. The season opened with promising prospects for the factorymen, as high as 12c. being paid at the beginning of May. But June prices showed a slightly easier tendency, finest Ontario selling as low as 8c., but since then prices have steadily strengthened until the top prices of the season so far were reached this week.
