Are in Flames—The Montreal Fire Department Sends Assistance—Likely Fire Under Control.

Montreal, Aug. 8.—An immense flour storage group of buildings, owned by the Lake-of-the-Woods Milling company, located at St. Louis de Mile End, a northern suburb, valued at \$300,000, has been burning for a couple of hours. The local brigade was unable to cope with the fire and a large portion of the Montreal brigade was sent to the assistance of the local firemen. The fire has already destroyed about half of the block of buildings, and, at last accounts, there were hopes of saving the balance. The loss is roughly estimated at \$150,000 to \$200,000.
