SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family. or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 150

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires; he may, on applica-tion to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate. receive authority for some one to make

HOMESTEAD DUTIES : A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one

(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. (2) If the father (or mother, father is deceased) of any person who eligible to make a hongstead entry un-der the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with (3) If the settler has his permaner

WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Coal.-Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected

on the gross output.
Quartz.—A free miner's certificate is granted upon payment in advance of 87.50 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital: A free miner, having discovered mineral place, may locate a claim 1,500x

The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the daim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, abon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 an acre. The patent provides for the payment royalty of 24 per cent on the sales.

A free miner may obtain two leases to term of twenty, years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior. the Bowels remedy, The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. 
