Dublin, Aug. 11.—An Irish family named O'Keefe have proved to their own satisfaction that the Emerald Isle legend of "rich relatives in America" is sometimes founded on fact. A fortune of \$11,500,000 is fact enough for any legend. This is what the O'Keefes claim to have obtained.
