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THE TRUE PURPOSE WAS TO MAKE KOREA A JAPANESE PROVINCE.

A Remarkable Debate at the Peace Conference—Mr. Witte Demanded Frankness—Settle Korea Question First. Portsmouth, N.H., Aug. 14.—The debate in Saturday's conference over the first condition, the recognition of Japan's "preponderating influence" over Korea, involving her right to control the administration of the "hermit kingdom," and to use the littoral for strategic purposes, etc., was of a remarkable character.

His attitude reveals plainly the Russian tactics. They propose to raise before the world the spectre of the "yellow peril." Russia claims that Japan's purpose is to get a foothold on the Asiatic continent from which to extend her influence and dominion.
