Turin, Italy, Aug. 15.—This is great day for Turin, being the fiftieth anniversary of the battle of Tchernaya, during the Crimean expedition in which about 15,000 Sardinian troops took part. King Victor Emanuel arrived here this morning and was received with great military and civil honors. In the afternoon there will be a grand parade and a review of the few survivors of the Sardinian corps under Gen. Marmora. The survivors of that battle. among them Senator and Gen. La Marmora, who saw their chief service in the Crimean expedition, will take the most prominent part in the celebration and will have the place of honor in the parade and review. ### 100,000 PEASANTS STARVING While Over a Million Others Are

Madrid, Aug. 15.-The disorders are growing alarmingly. The sacking of farms and slaughtering of sheep and gattle continue practically unchecked. The districts around Carmona, Ssuna, Estepa, Utrera, Maron and Jerez, are terrorized by hunger-driven pensants. The wealthier residents are fleeing and abandoning their homes, taking refuge in Seville, Cordova, and other large cities. The starving peasants continue to invade the towns clamoring for food, and sometimes looting. It is stated that 4,000 are massed outside Osuna, threatening tothe government and public charity i inadequate, and distributed slowly Troops are protecting many towns, but the authorities hesitate to take severe measures, partly through sympathy with the distress, and partly through fear lest a wave of violence
