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AN ARCH SWINDLER

S. H. DAVIS ARCHITECT, IN TOILS AT WINNIPEG.

Twenty Million Company—Robbed Men and Girls Under Pretence of Giving Employment—Bad Reputation in Toronto. Toronto, Pa., Aug. 13.—S. H. Davis, a Canadian, who has been posing in this city for some time past as the president of a \$20,000,000 syndicate, and who was arrested yesterday as a suspicious person by Detective Cecil G. Rice, was brought to jail this morning, for a hearing by Magistrate George A. Moke, at Central police station, on Tuesday. Davis is alleged to have been carrying on a swindling scheme of a wholesale plan, and several people who claim to have been deceived by him are preparing to lodge informations against him.

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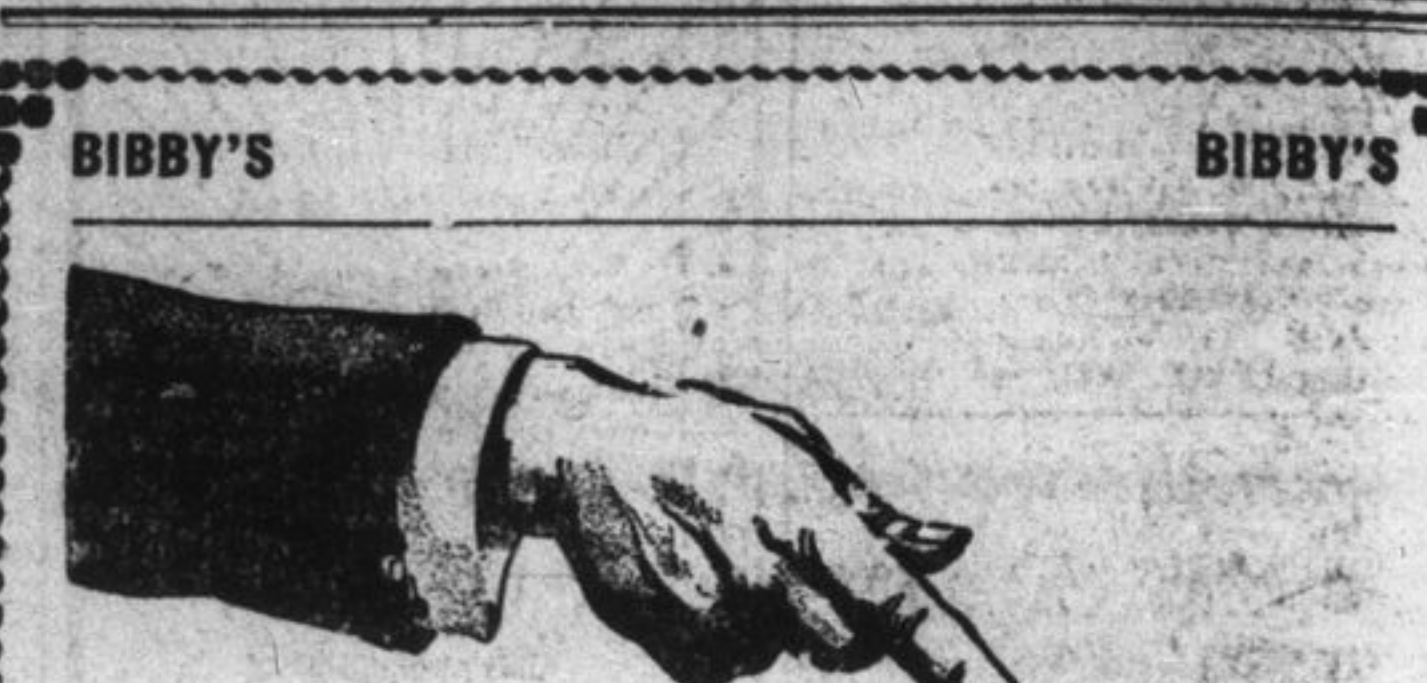
