

Finally the husband became so weak that he sank to the floor. The wife wife heard him fall and asked :

"Mother, is he dead ?" "I don't know," the mother replied. 'Open the door and see. "Oh I guess not," Mrs. Winstandley

The mother carried the husband to his room and placed him in bed, where he regained consciousness. Curiosity also got the better of the wife, and she opened the door of her room, Not seeing her husband on the floor. walked to his room. As she entered she swallowed the carbolic acid and threw herself on his bed. She died in Sept. 7-9. his arms several minutes later.

The mother apparently had taken the girl into the room, placed her i the tub and held her head under water until she died. The husband swooned when the news of his daugh-27-28. ter's death was brought to him and a physician was sent for. As he removed the bed sheet he saw bloodstains Oct. 2-3. and found that Winstandley had been shot. The bullet had entered the body near the breast, but made only a su-Oct. 4. perficial wound. Despite the wound Oct. 4-5. and his illness, it was said he pro-Oct. 4-6. bably would recover.
