According to press despatches sent out from Ottawa, various places throughout the dominion are to be provided with rifle ranges. No word is said about Kingston, yet this city is a far more important military centre than any of the places named.

The observing layman, reading the newspaper reports sent out from Ottawa, concerning new defence works for Kingston, and denials of the same, wonders what it all means.

Speaking of forts, batteries, etc., brings to mind the fact that the United States government is engaged in stretching a line of "barracks" along the western frontier.

The authorities of the department of militia and defence, Ottawa, should take immediate steps towards having repaired the wharf and piers along the waterfront of Tete de Pont Barracks.

Some years ago the subject of establishing a Garrison Club was informally discussed by local officers, but the scheme was allowed to rest in abeyance.

The artillerymen ought to enjoy their outing in the wilds of Petawawa, provided they are favored with fine weather.

Only gunners of the militia field batteries will go to Petawawa camp for firing exercise; the drivers will be left at home.

Drill pay for the 14th Regiment has been received, it was found that the men will receive efficiency pay.
