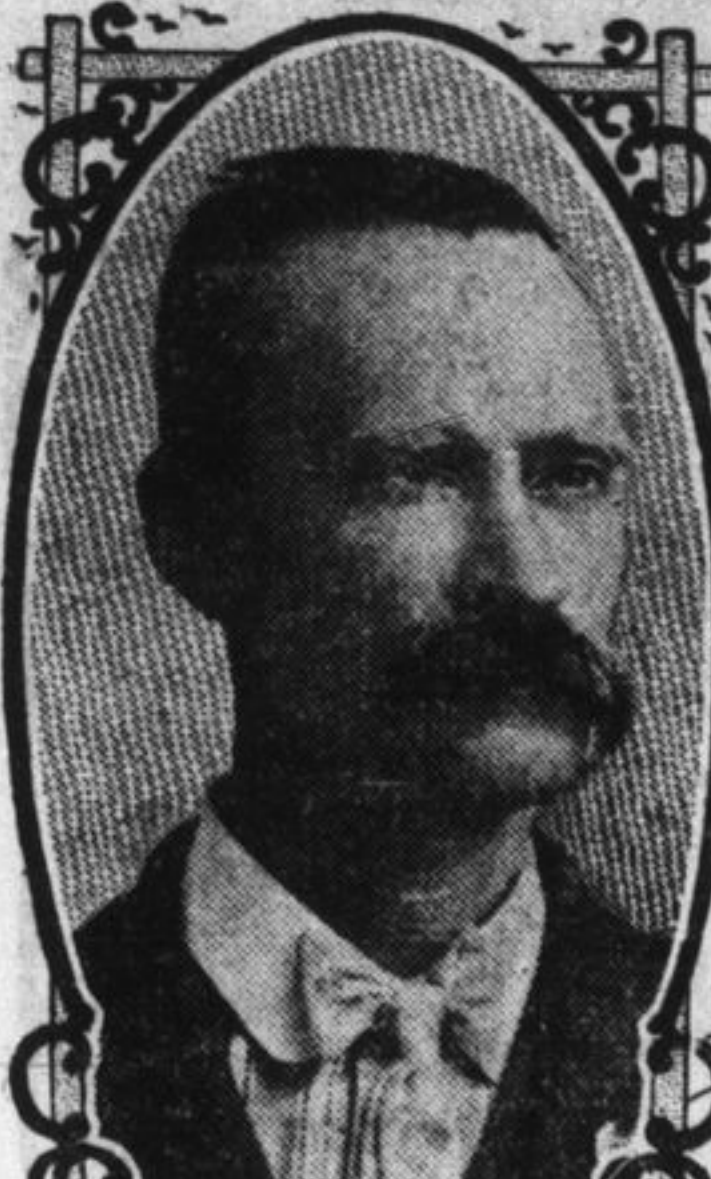

The business of wheat buying in the North-West has reached such large proportions that some information with regard to the method of handling the business may be of interest. The financing of the wheat is done almost entirely through the Winnipeg banks. The large milling companies and elevator companies have a great number of points throughout the country at which they buy wheat through their country elevators, in addition to this at each buying station they have arrangements, usually with a country storekeeper who pays out the amount in cash to the farmer on produce receipts, and signed by the elevator man. During the wheat buying season every morning the head offices of the companies in Winnipeg send a list to their banks of the amount to be remitted to the different country elevators. These amounts are usually distributed in small sums running from \$1,000 up to \$10,000, and the daily disbursements of some of the larger companies some \$2,500 to \$4,500, quarters, 75c. to \$1.50; cuts, 13c.; veal, carcass, 6c.; cuts, 10c. to 15c.; hogs, on the hoof, 7c.; pork, carcass, 9c.; cuts, 12c.
