SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 100

Entry may be made personally at the the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigra-tion, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make HOMESTEAD DUTIES ; A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required to perform the con-ditions connected therewith under one

the following plans:
(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to

residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with he father or mother.

(8) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the

APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, be-fore the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector.

Before making application for patent
the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention

WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Coal.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can he acquired by one individual or com-pany. Royalty at the rate of ten cents her ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected

Quartz .- A free miner's certificate granted upon payment in advance of \$7.50 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital.

A free minor, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 an acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2½ per cent on the sales. PLACER mining claims generally are

A free miner may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.

Offered is \$7,000,000-Company Not Living Up to Its Contract - Serious Considerations in the Way of a Peaceful Settlement.

Jersey City, N.J., Aug. 29.-Considerable interest is manifested in the meeting of the board of directors of the American-China Development com-pany, which is held here, to-day. Under the existing conditions, however, the problem is far more complicated, as a great deal more than a mere financial consideration depends upon the decision of the board. Some years ago the American-Chinese Development company obtained

valuable concessions for the building of a railroad from Hankow through the central and eastern part of China. The company built a railroad between Hankow and Canton, a distance about thirty miles. Since then practically nothing has been done. The Chinese government has repeatedly urged the company to extend its line and avail itself of the rights and privileges vouchsafed by the concessions, but nothing came of it. The Chinese government is evidently anxious that the railroad should be built or, that the American-China Development company should live up to its contract with the Chinese government. It made an offer of \$7,000,000 for the aban

It has been asserted that the Chinese government is determined to take the concessions from the Americans and that it will probably revoke them apon the ground that the company made no effort within a reasonable time to carry out the object for which the concessions were granted.


