SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, or 320 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the land is in the vicinity of a homestead, the settler may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situated, receive authority for some one to make entry for him.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector.

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Coal—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year for the mining re-quirements in lieu thereof.

When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 an acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2 1/2 per cent on the value of the output of the mine.

A free miner may obtain two leases to a dredge for gold or five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.

The lease shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles of river leased.

Royalty at the rate of 2 1/2 per cent on the output of the mine is payable \$10,000 on the output of the mine.

SEEKING CONCESSION THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT WANTS THE RAILROAD.

Sum Offered is \$7,000,000—Company Not Living Up to Its Contract—Serious Considerations in the Way of a Peaceful Settlement.

Special to the Whig. Jersey City, N.J., Aug. 29.—Considerable interest is manifested in the meeting of the board of directors of the American-China Development company, which is held here, to-day.

Under ordinary conditions the question would have been comparatively simple and the problem would have resolved itself into a simple mathematical calculation of the money value of the board of directors is that whether the offer of the Chinese government to purchase the concession previously granted to the American-China Development company for \$7,000,000 shall be accepted or not.

Some years ago the American-China Development company obtained valuable concessions for the building of a railroad from Hankow through the central and eastern part of China.

It was strongly suspected that the offer of the Chinese government was made not so much to stir the company into activity, as by cause the concessions granted to an American corporation to revert to the government, which since the beginning of the anti-exclusion agitation which led to a boycott, has shown a rather vindictive spirit against Americans in general.

J. Pierpont Morgan and the other American capitalists, standing behind the American-China Development company, who hold the majority of the stock, were inclined to favor the acceptance of China's offer.

Joe Walcott has not retired from the ring. The Toronto team is hoodooed by somebody.

The international cricket match, Canada vs. the United States, began at Rosedale yesterday.

Fred. Haskins, said to be one of the best known bookmakers in the country is dead at Toronto.

In the lacrosse world Montreal must have gone woefully back or else Caps have developed a lower of strength.

By the way, Montrealeux will try to have Dade and Finlayson reinstated by the C.A.A.U. on September 16th.

An invitation has been extended to Prince Louis of Battenberg to attend the international cricket match at Toronto.

Housser, who has been with Rochester, and who reverts to Louisville at the close of the season, will fill Harry's place in the Toronto outfield.

The fifth annual tournament of the Dominion Trap Shooters' Association is voted the most successful meet that our Canadian gun men have ever held.

"Tommy" Beasley is dead. He was the most famous amateur tripleplechase rider that Ireland, the home of so many great riders, has seen in his time.

A Saratoga gambler has cleaned up enough this season to purchase the site for a \$4,000 casino, which perchance doesn't make the local hand books turn green with envy.

Jimmy Gardner of Lowell, won his fight with Buddy Ryan at Colma in the fifteenth round of a twenty-five-round bout. The men weighed in at 142 pounds. William Roche was referee. He declared all bets off.

The world's record for the fifty-six-pound weight thrown from stand, without follow, was broken, Saturday, by John Flanagan, of the Irish-American Athletic Club at New York, who hit the missile thirty-one feet and five inches.

Jackie Swain is a rough riding little bear. He cut across his field with Oddeletta in his last race and Jackie's Stille, on Mammie Algot, and Finch, on Blue Grouse, claimed a foul. As the judges did not think Swaine's action altered the natural result of the race, they refused to recognize the claim made by Stille and Finch.

Manager and Centre-fielder Dick Har-ley, of the Toronto club, threw up his position as leader of the Toronto team on Saturday afternoon, and will be succeeded, on September 1st, by Edward Harrow, who won the pennant for Toronto in 1902. The latter purchased his release from the Indianapolis club at the solicitation of President Seitz and his associates.

The Prince of Wales' cup, which has been in the possession of the Royal Halifax Yacht Squadron since its presentation to the club in 1850 by the present king of England, was won by the schooner Florida II, of the New York Yacht Club, owned by F. F. Brewster, of New Haven, Conn., and for the first time in its history the trophy passes into the keeping of a foreign club.

The question has been asked by what right Durnan and Sullivan rowed for the American championship on Wednesday last. In 1901 Ned Hanlan lost the title to Jack Gaudaur at Oreglin. No one ever beat the Oreglin for this title, though he was defeated by Towns at Rat Portage for the world's championship. On Gaudaur's retirement the title was shared with no claimant.

CUT TO STOP VENOM. Old Man's Surgery of No Avail to 'Save Life.'

Renovo, Pa., Aug. 29.—Archibald Barr, of Austin Hill, aged sixty years, is dying from a self-inflicted wound in the wrist, made to overcome the poison of a rattlesnake.

Mr. Barr was burying on the mountains yesterday when he walked into a den of rattlesnakes. He had killed five and was stooping for a stone with which to strike another when a snake which he had not seen sank its fangs into his hand.

He was three miles from home and alone. He thrust the blade of his knife into the wrist and made a gash nearly an inch long, from which the blood gushed. When he reached home he was exhausted from the loss of blood.

The snake venom, too, had turned his arm black, and it was greatly swollen. Dr. Murrell says the old man has but one chance out of ten to recover.

ON PARLOR CAR STEP. With the Train Whizzing on and Vestibule Door Locked.

Williamsport, Pa., Aug. 29.—George H. Bron, a rich lumberman, and his wife had a terrifying experience on a fast Pennsylvania train last night. They rode five miles while clinging to the railing of a parlor car, having only the step of the car on which to stand. They boarded the train at Watsontown, but the porter of the car failed to open the vestibule door and the train got under headway. Mrs. Bron clutched the handle of the door while Mr. Bron held fast to the guard rail.

The telegraph operator at Watsontown saw their perilous position as the train ran past the station, and sent a message to Howard tower, five miles up the line, to flag the express. When the train reached the tower Mrs. Bron was found to be in a condition of nervous collapse.

DUCKS EAT HAILSTONES. And Are Frozen to Death—Made a Mistake.

Colorado Springs, Col., Aug. 29.—Evidently mistaking hailstones for corn, six ducks belonging to Samuel Hodgson, of Florence, Colo., ate heartily of them and died soon afterward. When cut open they were found frozen inside. The life of another of Mr. Hodgson's ducks was saved by pouring hot water into its craw.

The ducks, which had remained in the shelter of a barn during a heavy hailstorm, rushed out when the storm subsided and were seen by members of the Hodgson family gobbling up the icy lumps. Soon they began to stand on one foot and then on the other as on winter days. One after another they fell to the ground and died within a few minutes.

VALLEY SEALED BY ROCK. Big Stone Falls, Blocking Pass Leading to Place.

Vasna, Aug. 26.—One of the favorite summer resorts of the Viennese, the Hollenthal, has just been the scene of a fall of rock which blocked the valley and cut off everybody within from the outer world.

The Hollenthal, or Hell Valley, lies off the celebrated railway line which climbs the Scemmering pass. It is entered through a narrow gap in the hills, and is a charming place for a short stay. Apparently the fall of rock occurred at the narrow entrance and a considerable number of visitors from Vienna are interred at Kaiserbrunn and Weichthal until communication can be restored.

A violent thunder-storm was raging at the time of the fall of rock.
