



SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on applica-tion to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for receive authority for some one to make entry for him. HOMESTEAD DUTIES: A settler who has been granted an entry for a home-stead is required to perform the con-

(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry un-

upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homeresidence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with (8) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, heore the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention WEST MINING REGULATIONS.
