

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family. or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated; or if the homesteader desires, he may, on applica-tion to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigra-tion, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make HOMESTEAD DUTIES : A settler who

has been granted an entry for a home

stead is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one the following plans: (1) At least six months residence upor and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry un-der the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home stead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may

(8) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the APPLICATION FOR PATENT should

be satisfied by such person residing with

be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Do-minion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents er ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected Quartz .- A free miner's certificate is ranted upon payment in advance of \$7.50 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital.

A free minor, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on theclaim each year or paid to the mining re-corder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may. upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 an acre.

PLACER mining claims generally are 100 feet square; entry fee \$5, renewable Extract of Wild Strawberry. A free miner may obtain two leases to redge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior. The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental. \$16 per annum for each mile of river lensed. Hoyalty at the rate of 2½ per cent collected on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.

### THE NEW PROVINCES

START OFF UNDER GOOD AUSPICES.

More Land in Them Than in Older Provinces Many Railway Lines in Operation-Fine Financial State.

Montreal Gazette. the provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan began their existence on September 1st, under specially favorable circumstances. They are of large extent. Alberta is estimated to contain a land area of 250,653, and Saskatche wan of 243,192 square miles. Each ex-tends from the United States boundary to the 69th parallel of north lati tude. Each contains a greater extent of cultivatable land than any of the older provinces. Between them they offer to the farm seeker the greatest unoccupied territory in North America. they are at the beginning of the twentieth century. As fertile as Manitobe they are four times the size of what is probably to-day the most famous wheat-growing province in the world. They have within their boundaries land adapted for all classes of agricultural industry. Grain grows from the Manitoba boundary to the foothills of the Rockies. There is a splendid ranching district. Alberta wool growers are already large producers of a staple which meets an unfailing demand. Coal raising is a developed in-dustry. 
