west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not enerved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family. or any male over 18 years of age, to the satent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less. nomesteader desires, he may, on applica-tion to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate,

and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with he father or mother.


