CASE OF DR. SNIDER

Should Give Inside History of London Advertiser.

There is a mutiny in the conservative camp over the prospective appointment of Dr. Snider, of Waterford, as superintendent of the Toronto asylums. Mr. Whitney and the provincial secretary deny that the appointment has been made.

Technical assistance is being given to the lieutenant-governor, who is on his vacation, by the Ontario government.

It is not denied that Dr. Snider was the government's choice. The Toronto World takes its political friends to task and says in effect that the appointment would be an affront on the conservative party.

Dr. Snider, it will be remembered, was one of the beneficiaries of the purity fund raised on behalf of the conservative candidates in the Ontario elections of 1902. He was elected, but was unseated upon petition. In the trial proceedings he admitted receiving \$500 from the purity fund for election expenses. The check for this amount was accompanied by a written request that he would return any money which he did not use. His expenses, according to his own testimony, were between \$100 and \$200. The balance he kept in his pocket. This did not reveal Dr. Snider as a man of fine ethical distinctions, but it did not cost him the confidence of his supporters, for he was renominated at the ensuing bye-elections. Apparently he has not deprived him of the esteem of his leaders either. The subscribers of the purity fund have not been given to the public. Perhaps Dr. Snider can throw some light upon it. Perhaps his possession of this information has some connection with the government's anxiety to do him a good turn. The question now is, will Dr. Snider get the berth for which he is slated, or will the government be frightened into withdrawing his name?
