



SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST.

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-ion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, per any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES: A settler who has been granted an entry for a home-stead is required to perform the con-

ditions connected therewith under one the following plans:

(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.
(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with (6) If the settler has his permanent

residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his honestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Do-minion Lands at Ottawa; of his intention

Not more than 320 acres can he acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents her ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected on the gross output. Quartz.-A free miner's certificate is granted upon payment in advance \$7.50 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital. A free miner, having discovered mineral
