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



MONSTER GORILLAS

Ki'led by a Frenchman Weighed 720 Pounds.

Paris, Sept. 18 .- M. Euegene Brusseux, a French official and an explor er, has just returned from Algiers, bringing with him photographs o giant gorillas, one of which was killed by his escort of native sharpshoot-

The animal is of great size, being seven feet six inches in height, while the width of the shoulders is four

One of its hands when cut off weighed six pounds, while the carcase turnthe scale at 120 pounds, and the united efforts of eight native soldiers were necessary to drag it to the French residency at Ouessou, the administrative centre of Central Sangha where M. Dupont, the government administrator, buried the animal and so preserved the skeleton.


