SYSTEM OF SIGNALS.

Used by the Poaching U.S. Fish Tugs. Special to the Whig. Detroit, Mich., Sept. 21.—The Canadian fisheries cruiser, Vigilant, stopped here, for minor repairs, before leaving port (Capt. Dunn said the American poaching fish tugs kept thoroughly posted as to the whereabouts of the Vigilant, and have a fine system of warning each other of the cruiser's approach. They have a fleet of about seventy tugs. The speediest are placed at the head of the lake in the direction in which the Vigilant is likely to go. When the cruiser is sighted the American waters off full steam for the her and follows suit, and so on all along the line. It is believed that, at least, \$12,000 worth of fish are taken by poachers from the Canadian waters.

ACCUSED OF MURDER.
