

All that the leaders hope is that the conference may create a permanent organization of the churches, which will bring them into better and closer relations than ever before existed. It is hoped that an organization may be formed that will voice the attitude of the united Protestant churches on all great questions of a religious, social, ethical and economic character,

The general committee in charge expects that there will be from 500 to 600 delegates, representing twenty-four religious denominations; wit an aggregate membership of over 18. 000,000. At the conference will heard the leading men in nearly every Protestant religious body in the country. Among them will be five bishops of the Episcopal church six bishops of the Methodist church, three of the Methodist church south two Moravian bishops, and one each from the United Brethren, Reformed Episcopal and African Methodist


