surance companies pay to their policy holders dividends averaging not more than 1.25 per cent, while savings banks pay approximately 3 per cent. though the banks are restricted greatly in the character of the investments they may make, is being definitely answered in the exposures made through the New York state investigation committee. Treasurer Randolph of the New York Life Insurance company, gave testimony which is regarded as showing that much of the earnings is taken over by the subsidiary trust, and banking institutions, by high salaries and other devices,

A wide latitude is permitted insur ance companies in making investments. and this speculating privilege combined with the money-earning capacity that lies in huge sums as compared with petty amounts, should produce revenue in excess of the earnings of the savings banks with a like amount assets.
