SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, containing 80 and 200 acres, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in full therefor. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 an acre.
