SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Domin-ion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on applica-tion to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigra-tion, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him.
HOMESTEAD DUTIES: A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required to perform the con

ditions connected therewith under one the following plans : (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may

be satisfied by ich person residing with
