Ottawa, Oct. 6.—The will of the late Frances Mary Thistle, for which probate has been applied, disposes of the estate of \$179,491.45. The bulk of the estate goes to two sisters of the deceased. Two bequests, aggregating \$700, were made to charity.

TAKEN ALLEGIANCE. Agoncillo, Filipino Revolutionist, Accepts Inevitable.

Washington, Oct. 7.—Word comes from Manila of the conversion of Felipe Agoncillo, formerly one of the most rabid of the revolutionaries, for several years he had been the leading spirit in the Filipino junta at Hong Kong. Recently he decided to give up what had become a useless struggle, and like other members of the junta, to accept the inevitable.

TO CALL A HALT. In the Poaching Habits of the Americans.

Detroit, Oct. 6.—The United States revenue cutter Morrill left Detroit last night, having on board Collector of Customs Leach, Cleveland, who will take a hand in the work of putting a stop to the poaching of American fishery tugs in Canadian waters. The Morrill will cruise Lake Erie for several days, going as far east as Dunkirk.

CHARLES LAMARCHE Gets the Registrarship of East Nipissing.

Toronto, Oct. 6.—Charles Lamarche, former member for East Nipissing in the legislature, who resigned to make the way for Hon. Frank Cheneau, minister of mines, has been appointed registrar of deeds for East Nipissing. He succeeds John A. Loughrin, whose resignation was asked for on account of alleged active participation, but who refused to resign, being finally dismissed by order-in-council.

Failed To Prove It. Toronto, Oct. 6.—One of the two cases filed this morning, in a cave-in of the labor union at Liverpool, Ontario, has failed to prove that the union is an illegal organization.

Can Feed 200,000,000 People. London, Oct. 6.—Sir Henry Knight, ex-lord mayor of London, interviewed at Liverpool on his return from Canada, said he thought the North-West was quite capable of raising produce enough to feed a hundred million people.

Fourteen Are Dead. Troy, N.Y., Oct. 6.—Sixteen men were buried this morning, in a cave-in of the Vermont Slate company's quarry, near Granville, N.Y. David Caldwell and Warren Queen, the foreman of the quarry, were rescued. The latter is expected to die. The fourteen dead include J. B. Williams, chief agent of the company, and Hungarian laborers.

Threatened With Death. St. Petersburg, Oct. 6.—Alarming reports of threatened troubles at Asstrakan have been received here. Many revolutionists from Baku have arrived in that city, and have adopted a menacing attitude. The authorities have been all threatened with death if they oppose the wishes of the revolutionists.

Remanded For A Week. Ingersoll, Ont., Oct. 6.—The five men arrested on the charge of murdering Leash Wright, were up before Police Magistrate Macdonald this afternoon. Owing to the inquest not being completed the crown asked that the prisoners be remanded for a week. The request was granted.

Beallock over selection of candidates at Oswego, N.Y., continues. Some 109 ballots taken. A break was expected to-day.

Henry Hoffman and Mrs. Henry Schiller, are under arrest, at Chicago, charged with stealing \$30,000 diamonds and other valuables.

At the meeting of the Canadian Freight Association at Montreal, the resignation of John Earle, as secretary-treasurer was received, and Thomas Marshall, was appointed in his stead.

A daring daylight attempt to steal \$30,000 worth of jewels from Maiden Lane store, New York, was made, and a clerk who defended the treasure was stabbed. The robber was Louis Brown, a negro.

The modernization of methods of burglars, pickpockets, and confidence men was the ground given by Police Commissioner McAdoo for making a request for 1,000 new police patrolmen. He wants New York to have a police force of over 10,000 men or one officer for every 400 people.

The report of President C. D. Warren to the shareholders of the Lake Superior Corporation stated that the last Canadian property to remain in the receiver's hands, the Lake Superior Power company, has been released and has passed into the full control of the corporation within the past few days.
