NEWS OF CHURCHES
THE VARIOUS DOINGS IN THE RELIGIOUS WORLD.

Slanders Put Upon the Missionaries—The Genuine Expression of Hudson Taylor's Thoughts.
The First Baptist church, Woodstock, has decided to call Rev. Dr. Waffle, Newark, N. J., to succeed Rev. P. G. Mode.

Rev. S. P. Irwin, B.A., rector of the Anglican church at Waterloo, has been appointed by the Bishop of Huron to succeed Rev. Canon Downie as rector of Trinity church, Watford.

Princess Henry, of Battenberg (Princess Beatrice) is interested in the restoration of the chapel of St. Nicholas, Carisbrooke Castle, as a national memorial to King Charles I.

There is already a self-supporting Presbyterian church on the Island of Hilo in the Philippine Islands. For five years it was maintained as a mission.

Miss Susan Collins, the only representative of the Methodist Women's Foreign Missionary society, of African descent, in charge of the orphanage at Quessou, Africa, and has not lost an hour from sickness since June 1904.

The colleges of Japan now have some 5,000 Chinese students who are receiving an up-to-date education. They will return to China as missionaries of Japanese civilization. Since Japanese civilization is not quite the same as Christian civilization, the present is a most critical moment for China, and calls for greater efforts to make Christ lead both in Japan and in China.

A leading member of the Methodist church in New South Wales has bought the Lyceum theatre and hotel in Sydney, and some adjoining property, for about £31,000, and intends, after making certain necessary alterations at an expense of £20,000, to hand the whole over to the Sydney Central Methodist mission. A hall to seat 3,000, another to accommodate 200, an evangelists' home, a sisters' home, residential refuges for men and women, residential clubs for young men and for factory girls, gymnasium, etc., will be provided in the great central area.

QUEER LOTTERY
Street Car Tickets of Mexico May Draw Prizes.

Louis P. Brous, formerly a teacher in the Kansas City, Kan., high school, now of the City of Mexico, where he is employed by a packing company which operates a municipal slaughter house, is visiting his father-in-law, M. H. McManis, and friends in Wyandotte county, and friends in Kansas City, Kan. He gives some interesting facts about conditions in the Mexican capital, especially concerning its slaughtering business and the street railway management.

According to Mr. Brous, Mexico has a unique street railway system. Every passenger who rides on one of the cars receives a printed slip of paper very similar to one of the Metropolitan transfers in this city, which is, at once, a receipt for the fare and a ticket in a lottery which distributes \$5,000 in prizes every month. The prizes range from \$5 to \$1,000. Drawings are held between the first and fifth of each month for the holders of tickets given during the preceding month.

There is no ringing up of fares on the system and no transfers are given. The company has found it more profitable to pay out \$5,000 a month in lottery prizes than to trust its conductors with a fare registering system. Then, besides, the giving of prizes greatly stimulates travel. Each conductor when he goes to work has a book of the lottery tickets and must turn in money for all tickets given out during the day. The street car business is divided into first and second classes and the fare is respectively six and three cents. There are cars for each class. Smoking is allowed anywhere in the cars.

Prizes in the lottery are given with the six-cent fares as a basis. If a person should draw a prize on a three-cent ticket he would receive only half the amount. If a prize is drawn by a ticket for thirty cents given on some of the suburban lines the prize would be multiplied five times. So it is possible to draw a prize of \$5,000 on one ticket.

One of these tickets in the possession of Mr. Brous was punched Julio 15th and bore the name of the company, the Tranvias Electricos de Mexico. The ticket was yellow, with a big six in red ink, the lottery number on the end, and several lines of Mexican in the reverse side giving information concerning the drawings at the office of the company.

All of the car lines of the city lead to a central point, the Palacio Nacional and the Cathedral to the Zocalo, or park. From this point the cars circle about the city and return to their starting places. On most of the streets there are single track lines.

"The cars are modern and the company has a rule for getting on or off which I would recommend to this city," said Mr. Brous yesterday afternoon. "Passengers get on only at the rear and get off only in front. No violations of this rule are allowed."

FAVORITE TEXT
Of Queen Victoria—Copy in British Museum.

A recently issued list of additions made to the printed book department of the British Museum specifies amongst others a copy of the New Testament with these words written on the fly-leaf in the autograph of the late Queen Victoria: "I, Cor. xiii. 4 and 5. 'Love suffereth long, and is kind.' 'Love faitheth not.'—V. R. I., 1891." The testament, has been presented to the museum by Lord Ronald Sutherland-Gower, F.S.A., whose account of the origin of the inscription is given in these words: "During the month of August, 1901, I was laid up for three weeks in the Luisea Hospital at Aachen, after undergoing an operation which necessitated perfect quiet. Just before coming into the hospital I sent off to Lord Lorne (Marquis of Lorne, now Duke of Argyll) a little pocket-book that I had had by me some time, and asked him to beg the queen to write in it her favorite text 'Love, Kindly Light,' favorite text or chapter might be). In a short time I got the little book back with a letter from Lord Lorne, dated Osborne, August 2nd, in it he wrote, 'I asked the queen before chapel to put something in your book, and she said what she liked best was the text about charity, or love; this was just as we were walking towards the church.
