St. Petersburg Uneasy. London, Oct. 9.—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Times cables: "The startling news of rioting and bloodshed in Moscow, caused great uneasiness here. It is feared that the news may spread to St. Petersburg, and that we may witness a repetition of the events of a year ago. Several hundred Moscow students arrived this morning, possibly to take part in the funeral of Gen. Konradenko, which gave rise to a great popular demonstration at the railway station, where the body was conveyed to an adjoining street for interment."

A NATIONAL ARMY. Is Scheme Talked of By Arnold Foster. London, Oct. 9.—The Daily Chronicle announces, this morning, that Arnold Foster, secretary of state for war, is working out with an army council, a new scheme for increasing the national army, to a quarter of a million men, to be composed of militia, and supplemented by regulars and volunteers, available for foreign service.

BRITAIN, RUSSIA AND ASIA. Negotiations Concerning Afghanistan to Be Resumed. London, Oct. 9.—Negotiations in regard to their respective interests in central Asia will shortly be resumed between the British and Russian governments.

Want The Money Restored. New York, Oct. 9.—A demand has been made of John A. McCall of the New York Life Insurance company, that the \$128,767 campaign fund contribution be replaced in the treasury of the company under penalty of revocation of the company's license to transact business in Missouri for failure to comply with the demand.

No Reason For Strike. Pittsburg, Oct. 9.—John Mitchell, president of the United Mine Workers of America, asked regarding the possibilities of a strike next spring, said: "As far as I can judge, everything will work out harmonious in the end. I can see no reason why there should be a general coal strike next spring."

Auto Plunged Into Marsh. Athens, Mich., Oct. 9.—Walter Palmer, Athens, was instantly killed, Chaffeur Blake, Kalamazoo, fatally injured, and Mrs. Walter Palmer and her daughter, Frances, bruised in an automobile accident, yesterday.

PANIC AND DEATH. Tiffin, Oct. 9.—Several bombs were thrown at Cossacks last evening. A general panic ensued. Many persons were killed or wounded.

BRIDE WAS DROWNED. Husband Tried to Save Woman He Married. St. John, N.B., Oct. 9.—A telephone message from Musquash, N.B., says that Mrs. Lizzie McGuire, aged twenty-five, who but a few weeks ago was married to Robert McGuire, quartermaster of the Eastern Steamship company's steamer Calvin Austin, was drowned yesterday in Little Musquash harbor, near their home.

Fought Mad Dog. New York, Oct. 9.—Mrs. Richard C. Carl, wife of a farmer living near East Northport, Long Island, risked her own life to save her five-month-old baby when she entered a room and saw a mad dog that had strayed into the house about to spring at the child in a cot. The mother instantly seized the animal, which was frothing at the mouth, and although the dog tore her hand and bit her on the chin, she clung to him and carried him to the barn. There her husband, who had heard her screams, killed the animal as she held it.

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Serious Rioting. London, Oct. 9.—Advices from Nantthead, in the county of Cumberland, says there has been serious rioting by Italian miners in that locality.

To Introduce Electricity. New York, Oct. 9.—Electricity is to be introduced on the Erie railway as soon as possible.

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Will Decide The Matter. Sarnia, Ont., Oct. 9.—For several months Sarnia has been split up over the question whether street cars should be allowed to run on Sunday. The question will now be decided by Justice Meredith, presiding over the Lambton county assizes, in the case brought by Sarnia township against the Sarnia Street Railway company. The township seeks to prevent the street railway from operating cars on Sunday, except to commuters.

DEAD IN TROUSSEAU. News of Fiance's Alleged Theft Kills Bride-To-Be. Dunbar, Pa., Oct. 9.—Embroidered in her wedding gown in the eve of her wedding day, Miss Mary Barge was dead in the home of her parents, while her intended husband, John Mercen, is being hunted by county detectives.

No Trouble Last Night. St. Petersburg, Oct. 9.—No serious disorders occurred at Moscow last night. The situation is slightly more reassuring, this morning, but the strike is spreading.

A DELIBERATE PLOT. Was the Bomb-Throwing at Tiffin Yesterday. St. Petersburg, Oct. 9.—The throwing of bombs at the troops in Tiffin, yesterday morning, resulting in the soldiers firing on the people, appears to have been the outcome of a deliberate organized plot. The loss of life was confined to one Cossack and a bomb-thrower. Twenty persons were wounded.
