SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any unoccupied section of Dominion lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 25, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

1. The land to be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the homestead is desired, or by application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situated. Receive authority for some one to make entry for him.

2. If the settler, or settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under the following plans:

(1) If the settler, or settler, if the father is deceased of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under a farm in the vicinity of the land to be settled by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent will be satisfied by residence with father or mother.

(2) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the same land.

3. APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, by the local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector.

4. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

5. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal—Coal lands may be purchased at \$1.00 per acre, or sold for \$2.00 per acre. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. The fee for each five-acre tract is ten cents. A fee of 2,000,000 dollars shall be collected on a quarter-acre miner's certificate is granted upon payment of an advance of \$7.50 per acre for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per acre for a company, according to the amount of coal discovered in place, may locate a claim 1,500 ft. wide.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year for five years, and a recorder in law thereof. When \$500 has been expended on the claim, the locator may upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1.00 per acre.

The patent provided for the payment of a royalty of 2 1/2 per cent on the sales.

PLACED mining claims generally are 100 feet square; entry fee \$5, renewable for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior. The lease for five miles, renewable in operation within one season from the date of the lease for five miles. Rental, \$10 per annum for each mile of river leased. Royalty at the rate of 2 1/2 per cent collected on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.

THERE WAS RARE FUN AT THEM.

The Events Were Watched With Interest by Over Six Hundred Persons—Powell, of Ottawa, is Champion.

A goodly number of city folk and a contingent of Queen's collegians journeyed over the Ottawa bridge to see the continuation of the Royal Military College sports (by permission of the acting commandant, Major E. V. O. Hewitt), on Saturday afternoon. Far from a "sprinkling," a perfect shower of feminine element, watched with keen interest the several events, their dainty frocks and the red, and white of the cadets, adding a pretty touch of color on the beautiful green campus. It was an ideal autumn day, sunny and warm, yet tempered with a cool breeze. Promptly at 2:30 o'clock, the bugle sounded and the fun began, holding the attention of the six hundred or more spectators for at least three hours. Those who had the handling of the programme were Judges: Major Scott, Professor Butler, Professor Lanos, Referee, Professor Martin, Starter, Sgt. Serjt., Major Prince, Timekeepers, Capt. Anderson, Professor Laird, Clerks of the course, H.S.M. Powell, Sgt. Hale, Cadet Warren, Cadet Hutton.

The results were:

Three-legged race—Ryerson and Armstrong. Ridout and Trotter. This event proved huge fun for the crowd, who rejoiced at the awkwardness and mishaps in the way of falls, etc., of the contestants.

120 yards hurdle race (ten hurdles)—Haggarty, 19 sec.; Ryerson, Hutton. It was conceded by not a few who "knew" that Armstrong would have been the winner, had he not been run into by Adams, and knocked down. It was a coincidence that Armstrong fell in the same race at Queen's sports.

Servants' children's race (fifteen and under, handicap, one yard a year)—Albert Anson; Joseph Anson; Fred. Anson. It was rather unique to have three brothers win, with five entries. The little chaps ran well.

Quarter mile race—Warren, 50 1/5 sec.; Powell, Hutton.

Bicycle obstacle race—Ringwood, Tisdale. This proved lively amusement for the spectators, but was rather hard work for the several contestants.

Five mile race (one team of four from each class)—At Class Powell, Faking Haggarty, Ryerson; 3rd Class, 2nd Class.

High jump—Hutton, 5 feet; Akins (Queen's champion), Carruthers. There was general self-satisfaction among the cadets that one of their own number carried off the laurels, hence, inasmuch as it was a triumph over the champion from Queen's.

220 yards race—Williams (Queen's), 25 sec.; O'Brien (Queen's); Letherland (Queen's). What a yell the college boys

set up when their three representatives out-distanced the R. M. C. Cadets. The-of-war (final)—B. vs. C; won by B.

Event for officers long course (hurdle race)—Capt. Marshall, Lieut. Williams.

Obstacle race—Gibson, Tremayne, Carson. The crowd went fairly wild with excitement over the strenuousness of this event. The racers had a race down hill to the pier, across to the other landing by a cable or a swim, through suspended barrels, barb wire entanglement, up and down hill over a large shed, a climb up one side of a tower, down the other and a spurt to the finish. Big and little, old and young, everyone followed the race with intense eagerness, chasing over the course like mad.

The winner of the championship was A. T. Powell of Ottawa, B.S.M., 1st Class, third year, by 14 points, with Warren 4 points behind.

The long course officers desired to mark the event by a prize to the recruit making the highest number of points and this was won by Cadet Hutton.

The English Association football team under the leadership of Sir Charles Kirkpatrick, defeated a picked team of Philadelphians, four goals to one at Haverhill, Mass.

Billy Lea, one of McGill's best wing men, will not return to college this year, and his loss will be much felt by the team. Lea is at present in Nova Scotia, and will remain there for some time.

Hacker's Pride, the only horse to win the Cambridgehire twice, was purchased recently by Sir Tatton Sykes, for 5,000 guineas, and her racing days are over, as she will at once be retired to the stud.

Negotiations between Arthur Duffy, former champion runner of the world, and Archie Hahn, the crack western sprinter, may result in a match race between Hahn and J. W. Morton, the English champion, at Madison Square Garden next week.

McGill is scheduled to play Ottawa College in Montreal on the 26th of this month. They will strive to have this month changed to October, 26th, Thanksgiving Day, as no college clash with the Westmount-Montreal game, which is to be played on the 28th.

Danny Maher is the leading rider in England this season, having a good lead, both in percentage and number of wins. Up to September 26th, he had won 82 races out of 320 mounts, O. Madden is his nearest opponent, with 80 wins out of 593 times at the post.

There seems to be an abundance of horses in England just now. At Newbury last week ninety horses ran in six races, an average of more than sixteen to the race. Newbury is the newest English race course, and is said to be the most up-to-date racing plant in England.

Ten thousand people saw the Capital team of Ottawa play the champion West Westminsters on the fair grounds, at the first of the series of the "Capital" week-end races. A great interest was evinced in the visit of the eastern team, who were seen for the first time this side of the Rockies. The home team won 3 to 2.

Anniversary of Chicago Fire.

Chicago, Ill., Oct. 9.—Today is the 34th anniversary of the day on which Mrs. O'Leary's famous cow kicked over a burning kerosene lamp in its stable in La Salle street, which started a fire which swept through the whole city and destroyed it. The event is not generally celebrated, but several societies, among them the Old Settlers and Pioneer societies, held anniversary celebrations this evening.

The great Chicago fire burned about twenty-five hours and during that time destroyed within a district about 17,150 houses, including the city hall, the court house with all its records, the post office and many other public buildings.
